AN ACT

- To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to conduct a study regarding the accessibility of websites of the Department of Veterans Affairs to individuals with disabilities.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "VA Website Accessi-3 bility Act of 2019".

4 SEC. 2. STUDY REGARDING THE ACCESSIBILITY OF
5 WEBSITES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF VET6 ERANS AFFAIRS TO INDIVIDUALS WITH DIS7 ABILITIES.

8 (a) STUDY.—Not later than 180 days after the date 9 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Veterans 10 Affairs shall examine all websites (including attached files 11 and web-based applications) of the Department of Veterans Affairs to determine whether such websites are ac-12 13 cessible to individuals with disabilities in accordance with section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 14 794d). 15

(b) REPORT.—Not later than 90 days after completing the study under subsection (a), the Secretary shall
submit a report to Congress regarding such study. The
report shall include the following:

(1) A list of each website, file, or web-based application described in subsection (a) that is not accessible to individuals with disabilities in accordance
with section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973
(29 U.S.C. 794d).

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the barriers to bringing such website, file, or web based application into compliance with the require ments of such section, including barriers relating to
 staffing.

5 (3) The plan of the Secretary to bring each
6 website, file, or web-based application identified in
7 the list under paragraph (1) into compliance with
8 the requirements of section 508 of the Rehabilitation
9 Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794d).

(c) DEFINITION OF WEBSITE.—In this section, the
term "website" includes a kiosk at a Department of Veterans Affairs medical facility, the use of which is required
to check in for scheduled appointments.
