AN ACT

To make technical corrections to the Guam World War II
Loyalty Recognition Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS TO GUAM WORLD**
2 **WAR II LOYALTY RECOGNITION ACT.**

3 Title XVII of division A of Public Law 114–328 is
4 amended—

5 (1) in section 1703(e)—

6 (A) by striking “equal to” and inserting
7 “not to exceed”; and

8 (B) by striking “covered into the Treasury
9 as miscellaneous receipts” and inserting “used
10 to reimburse the applicable appropriations”;

11 (2) in section 1704(a) by striking “, subject to
12 the availability of appropriations,” and inserting
13 “from the Claims Fund”; and

14 (3) by striking section 1707(a).

15 **SEC. 2. BUDGETARY TREATMENT OF TECHNICAL AMEND-**
16 **MENTS.**

17 (a) DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.—As
18 the budgetary effects for spending provided by this Act
19 were estimated and offset as part of the enactment of the
20 Guam World War II Loyalty Recognition Act (title XVII
21 of division A of Public Law 114–328), the budgetary ef-
22 fects of this Act shall be determined as if the amendments
23 made by this Act were included in the enactment of the
24 Guam World War II Loyalty Recognition Act (title XVII
25 of division A of Public Law 114–328), for purposes of the

1 Congressional Budget Act of 1974 and the Statutory Pay-
2 As-You-Go Act of 2010.

3 (b) PAY-AS-YOU-GO COMPLIANCE.—The budgetary
4 effects of this Act, for the purpose of complying with the
5 Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010, shall be deter-
6 mined by reference to the latest statement titled “Budg-
7 etary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this Act, sub-
8 mitted for printing in the Congressional Record by the
9 Chairman of the House Budget Committee, provided that
10 such statement has been submitted prior to the vote on
11 passage.
