A BILL

To require the Speaker of the House of Representatives to convene a session of the House on each day in which a Government shutdown is in effect, to prohibit the use of funds for the official travel of Members of the House of Representatives during any period in which a Government shutdown is in effect, and for other purposes.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “No Outbound Flights
3 for Lawmakers If Government Halts to a Stop Act” or
4 the “No Flights Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. REQUIRING SPEAKER TO CONVENE SESSION OF**
6 **HOUSE DURING SHUTDOWN.**

7 (a) **REQUIREMENT.**—On each day on which a Gov-
8 ernment shutdown is in effect, including weekends and
9 legal public holidays, the Speaker of the House of Rep-
10 resentatives shall convene a session of the House.

11 (b) **EXERCISE OF RULEMAKING AUTHORITY.**—This
12 section is enacted by Congress—

13 (1) as an exercise of the rulemaking power of
14 the House of Representatives, and as such it is
15 deemed a part of the rules of the House of Rep-
16 resentatives, and it supersedes other rules only to
17 the extent that it is inconsistent with such rules; and

18 (2) with full recognition of the constitutional
19 right of the House of Representatives to change the
20 rules (so far as relating to the procedure of the
21 House) at any time, in the same manner, and to the
22 same extent as in the case of any other rule of the
23 House.

1 **SEC. 3. PROHIBITING MEMBER OFFICIAL TRAVEL DURING**
2 **SHUTDOWN.**

3 (a) PROHIBITION.—Except as provided in subsection
4 (b), no appropriated funds, including official funds of the
5 House of Representatives or funds available under any
6 Federal law, rule, or regulation, may be used to pay for
7 the costs of official travel by a Member of the House of
8 Representatives during any period in which a Government
9 shutdown is in effect.

10 (b) EXCEPTION FOR TRAVEL BY MEMBER TO WASH-
11 NGTON METROPOLITAN AREA.—Subsection (a) does not
12 apply with respect to travel by a Member of the House
13 of Representatives to the Washington Metropolitan Area.

14 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

15 (1) the term “Member of the House of Rep-
16 resentatives” means a Representative in, or Delegate
17 or Resident Commissioner to, the Congress; and

18 (2) the term “Washington Metropolitan Area”
19 means the District of Columbia, the Counties of
20 Montgomery and Prince Georges in Maryland, and
21 the Counties of Arlington, Fairfax, Loudoun, and
22 Prince William and the Cities of Alexandria and
23 Falls Church in Virginia.

24 **SEC. 4. DETERMINATION OF GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN.**

25 For purposes of this Act, a Government shutdown
26 shall be considered to be in effect if there is a lapse in

- 1 appropriations for any Federal agency or department as
- 2 a result of a failure to enact a regular appropriations bill
- 3 or continuing resolution.

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
