#### AN ACT

- To strengthen partnerships between historically Black colleges and universities and minority-serving institutions and the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Historically Black Col-				
3	leges and Universities (HBCUs) Homeland Security Part-				
4	nerships Act".				
5	SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT-WIDE STRATEGY FOR ENHANCED				
6	PARTNERSHIPS WITH HISTORICALLY BLACK				
7	COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES AND MINOR				
8	ITY-SERVING INSTITUTIONS.				
9	Not later than 90 days after the date of the enact-				
10	ment of this Act, the Secretary, acting through the Under				
11	Secretary for Strategy, Policy, and Plans of the Depart-				
12	ment, shall—				
13	(1) issue a Department-wide strategy to en-				
14	hance partnerships with historically Black colleges				
15	and universities and minority-serving institutions				
16	that includes yearly goals, including goals related to				
17	improving recruitment and hiring, research and de-				
18	velopment, and acquisition opportunities at such in-				
19	stitutions, through fiscal year 2025; and				
20	(2) require the head of each component of the				
21	Department to—				
22	(A) not later than 150 days after the date				
23	of the issuance under paragraph (1) of the De-				
24	partment-wide strategy, develop a component-				
25	specific action plan to implement such strategy;				

1	(B) monitor progress on such implementa-					
2	tion; and					
3	(C) not later than 1 year after the date of					
4	such issuance, report to the Secretary regarding					
5	progress on such implementation.					
6	SEC. 3. ENHANCEMENT OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT					
7	PARTNERSHIPS.					
8	The Secretary shall seek to enhance partnerships					
9	with historically Black colleges and universities and minor-					
10	ity-serving institutions with respect to administering the					
11	research and development activities of the Department by,					
12	among other things—					
13	(1) encouraging the participation of such col-					
14	leges, universities, and institutions in the research,					
15	development, testing, and evaluation programs and					
16	activities of the Department;					
17	(2) facilitating partnerships between such col-					
18	leges, universities, and institutions and private sec-					
19	tor stakeholders, national laboratories, and other					
20	academic institutions in areas important to home-					
21	land security, including cybersecurity, emergency					
22	management, and counterterrorism; and					
23	(3) distributing funds through Science and					
24	Technology Directorate grants, cooperative agree-					
25	ments, and contracts to such colleges, universities,					

- 1 and institutions for enhancements in areas impor-
- 2 tant to homeland security, including cybersecurity,
- 3 emergency management, and counterterrorism.

#### 4 SEC. 4. CAREER OPPORTUNITIES PARTNERSHIPS.

- 5 Not later than 120 days after the date of the enact-
- 6 ment of this Act, the Secretary, acting through the Chief
- 7 Human Capitol Officer of the Department, shall make
- 8 available to historically Black colleges and universities and
- 9 minority-serving institutions a current list of internship,
- 10 fellowship, scholarship, and recruitment opportunities
- 11 within the Department for students and recent graduates
- 12 of such colleges, universities, and institutions.

#### 13 SEC. 5. ACQUISITION PARTNERSHIPS.

- Not later than 120 days after the date of the enact-
- 15 ment of this Act, the Secretary, acting through the Chief
- 16 Procurement Officer of the Department, shall—
- 17 (1) identify how to increase the participation of
- historically Black colleges and universities and mi-
- 19 nority-serving institutions in Department acquisi-
- 20 tions, including identifying existing opportunities for
- 21 historically Black colleges and universities and mi-
- 22 nority-serving institutions to participate in the con-
- tracting program of the Small Business Administra-
- 24 tion for minorities; and

1	(2) disseminate to such colleges, universities,					
2	and institutions—					
3	(A) information identified in accordance					
4	with paragraph (1); and					
5	(B) current and future opportunities to					
6	participate in Department acquisitions.					
7	SEC. 6. ANNUAL REPORT.					
8	(a) Annual Report.—Not later than December 31,					
9	2020, and annually thereafter through 2026, the Sec-					
10	retary shall submit to the Committee on Homeland Secu-					
11	rity of the House of Representatives and the Committee					
12	on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the					
13	Senate a report on the efforts of the Department to part-					
14	ner with historically Black colleges and universities and					
15	minority-serving institutions to carry out this Act.					
16	(b) Reporting Requirements.—The annual re-					
17	ports required under subsection (a) shall include the fol-					
18	lowing:					
19	(1) A list of awards, including the cor-					
20	responding monetary value for each such award, to					
21	historically Black colleges and universities and mi-					
22	nority-serving institutions, disaggregated by grant,					
23	contract, cooperative agreement, and other research					
24	development test and evaluation activity, initiative					
25	and program.					

- (2) A description of how the Department is partnering with historically Black colleges and universities and minority-serving institutions under the programs referred to in sections 3 and 5, and how such programs have helped such colleges, universities, and institutions participate in acquisitions with the Department.
  - (3) A summary of outreach efforts to historically Black colleges and universities and minority-serving institutions, and an identification of any Department programs and initiatives in which such colleges, universities, and institutions are under-represented among institutions of higher education.
  - (4) A description of the status of efforts made by the Department pursuant to sections 2 and 4, including—
    - (A) for section 2, Department-wide goals pursuant to the Department-wide strategy to enhance partnerships with historically Black colleges and universities and minority-serving institutions under such section, and the status of efforts to implement action plans throughout the Department to carry out such strategy; and
    - (B) for section 4, participation rates in each internship, fellowship, scholarship, and re-

- cruitment opportunity referred to in such section, listed by historically Black college and university and minority-serving institution so participating.
- 5 (5) A list of memoranda of understanding en-6 tered into by the Department with historically Black 7 colleges and universities and minority-serving insti-8 tutions and information on the parties and scope of 9 each such memorandum of understanding.

#### 10 SEC. 7. DEFINITIONS.

- (1) DEPARTMENT.—The term "Department"
  means the Department of Homeland Security.
  - (2) HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGES AND UNI-VERSITIES.—The term "historically Black colleges and universities" means a part B institution described in section 322(2) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1061(2)).
- 19 (3) Institution of Higher Education.—The 20 term "institution of higher education" has the 21 meaning given such term in section 101 of the High-22 er Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001).
- 23 (4) MINORITY-SERVING INSTITUTIONS.—The 24 term "minority-serving institutions" means an insti-25 tution of higher education described in section

- 1 371(a) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
- 2 U.S.C. 1067q(a)).
- 3 (5) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
- 4 Secretary of Homeland Security.
