AN ACT

- To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the National Purple Heart Hall of Honor.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "National Purple Heart
3	Hall of Honor Commemorative Coin Act".
4	SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
5	The Congress finds the following:
6	(1) The National Purple Heart Hall of Honor's
7	mission is—
8	(A) to commemorate the extraordinary sac-
9	rifice of America's servicemen and service-
10	women who were killed or wounded by enemy
11	action; and
12	(B) to collect and preserve the stories of
13	Purple Heart recipients from all branches of
14	service and across generations to ensure that all
15	recipients are represented.
16	(2) The National Purple Heart Hall of Honor
17	first opened its doors on November 10, 2006, in
18	New Windsor, NY.
19	(3) The National Purple Heart Hall of Honor
20	is co-located with the New Windsor Cantonment
21	State Historic Site.
22	(4) The National Purple Heart Hall of Honor
23	is the first to recognize the estimated 1.8 million
24	United States servicemembers wounded or killed in
25	action representing recipients from the Civil War to
26	the present day, serving as a living memorial to their
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sacrifice by sharing their stories through interviews,
exhibits and the Roll of Honor, an interactive com-
puter database of each recipient enrolled.
SEC. 3. COIN SPECIFICATIONS.
(a) DENOMINATIONS.—The Secretary of the Treas-
ury (hereafter in this Act referred to as the "Secretary")
shall mint and issue the following coins:
(1) 5 GOLD COINS.—Not more than 50,000 5
coins, which shall—
(A) weigh 8.359 grams;
(B) have a diameter of 0.850 inches; and
(C) contain 90 percent gold and 10 percent
alloy.
(2) 1 SILVER COINS.—Not more than 400,000
\$1 coins, which shall—
(A) weigh 26.73 grams;
(B) have a diameter of 1.500 inches; and
(C) contain not less than 90 percent silver.
(3) Half-dollar clad coins.—Not more
than 750,000 half-dollar coins which shall—
(A) weigh 11.34 grams;
(B) have a diameter of 1.205 inches; and
(C) be minted to the specifications for half-
dollar coins contained in section $5112(b)$ of title
31, United States Code.

(b) LEGAL TENDER.—The coins minted under this
 Act shall be legal tender, as provided in section 5103 of
 title 31, United States Code.

4 (c) NUMISMATIC ITEMS.—For purposes of section
5 5134 of title 31, United States Code, all coins minted
6 under this Act shall be considered to be numismatic items.
7 SEC. 4. DESIGN OF COINS.

8 (a) DESIGN REQUIREMENTS.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—The design of the coins
10 minted under this Act shall be emblematic of the
11 National Purple Heart Hall of Honor.

12 (2) DESIGNATION AND INSCRIPTIONS.—On
13 each coin minted under this Act there shall be—

14 (A) a designation of the value of the coin;
15 (B) an inscription of the year "2021"; and
16 (C) inscriptions of the words "Liberty",
17 "In God We Trust", "United States of Amer18 ica", and "E Pluribus Unum".

19 (b) SELECTION.—The design for the coins minted20 under this Act shall be—

(1) selected by the Secretary after consultation
with the Commission of Fine Arts and the National
Purple Heart Hall of Honor, Inc.; and

24 (2) reviewed by the Citizens Coinage Advisory25 Committee.

1 SEC. 5. ISSUANCE OF COINS.

2 (a) QUALITY OF COINS.—Coins minted under this3 Act shall be issued in uncirculated and proof qualities.

4 (b) MINT FACILITY.—Only the West Point Mint may
5 be used to strike any particular quality of the coins minted
6 under this Act.

7 (c) PERIOD FOR ISSUANCE.—The Secretary may
8 issue coins minted under this Act only during the 1-year
9 period beginning on January 1, 2021.

10 SEC. 6. SALE OF COINS.

(a) SALE PRICE.—The coins issued under this Act
shall be sold by the Secretary at a price equal to the sum
of—

14 (1) the face value of the coins;

(2) the surcharge provided in section 7(a) withrespect to such coins; and

17 (3) the cost of designing and issuing the coins
18 (including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery,
19 overhead expenses, marketing, and shipping).

20 (b) BULK SALES.—The Secretary shall make bulk
21 sales of the coins issued under this Act at a reasonable
22 discount.

23 (c) Prepaid Orders.—

24 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall accept
25 prepaid orders for the coins minted under this Act
26 before the issuance of such coins.

(2) DISCOUNT.—Sale prices with respect to pre paid orders under paragraph (1) shall be at a rea sonable discount.

4 SEC. 7. SURCHARGES.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—All sales of coins issued under this
6 Act shall include a surcharge of—

7 (1) \$35 per coin for the \$5 coin;

8 (2) \$10 per coin for the \$1 coin; and

9 (3) \$5 per coin for the half-dollar coin.

10 (b) DISTRIBUTION.—Subject to section 5134(f)(1) of 11 title 31, United States Code, all surcharges received by the Secretary from the sale of coins issued under this Act 12 13 shall be promptly paid by the Secretary to the National 14 Purple Heart Hall of Honor, Inc., to support the mission 15 of the National Purple Heart Hall of Honor, Inc., including capital improvements to the National Purple Heart 16 Hall of Honor facilities. 17

(c) AUDITS.—The National Purple Heart Hall of
Honor, Inc., shall be subject to the audit requirements of
section 5134(f)(2) of title 31, United States Code, with
regard to the amounts received under subsection (b).

(d) LIMITATION.—Notwithstanding subsection (a),
no surcharge may be included with respect to the issuance
under this Act of any coin during a calendar year if, as
of the time of such issuance, the issuance of such coin

1 would result in the number of commemorative coin pro2 grams issued during such year to exceed the annual two
3 commemorative coin program issuance limitation under
4 section 5112(m)(1) of title 31, United States Code (as in
5 effect on the date of the enactment of this Act). The Sec6 retary of the Treasury may issue guidance to carry out
7 this subsection.

8 SEC. 8. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.

9 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of 10 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010, 11 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement 12 titled "Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation" for this 13 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record 14 by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, pro-15 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the 16 vote on passage.
