- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Ensuring FEHBP
- 5 Coverage During Shutdowns Act".

1 SEC. 2. DESIGNATING CERTAIN FEHBP-RELATED SERVICES

- 2 AS EXCEPTED SERVICES UNDER THE ANTI-
- 3 **DEFICIENCY ACT.**
- 4 (a) In General.—Section 8905 of title 5, United
- 5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 6 lowing:
- 7 "(i) Any services by an officer or employee under this
- 8 chapter relating to enrolling individuals in a health bene-
- 9 fits plan under this chapter, or changing the enrollment
- 10 of an individual already so enrolled due to a qualifying
- 11 life event, shall be deemed, for purposes of section 1342
- 12 of title 31, services for emergencies involving the safety
- 13 of human life or the protection of property.".
- 14 (b) APPLICATION.—The amendment made by sub-
- 15 section (a) shall apply to any lapse in appropriations be-
- 16 ginning on or after the date of enactment of this Act.
