## A BILL

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Spouse Employment"

- 6 hancement Act of 2019" or the "SERVICE Act of 2019".

# SEC. 2. EXPANSION OF ELIGIBILITY FOR THE MY CAREER ADVANCEMENT ACCOUNT PROGRAM TO CER TAIN MILITARY SPOUSES.

4 (a) **PARTICIPANTS** WHOSE ELIGIBILITY FOR 5 SPOUSES RECEIVE PROMOTIONS.—A military spouse who is participating in the My Career Advancement Account 6 7 program of the Department of Defense (in this section referred to as the "Program") may not become ineligible 8 9 for the Program solely because the member of the Armed Forces to whom the military spouse is married receives 10 11 a promotion in grade.

(b) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 180 days
after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
of Defense shall submit to Congress a report regarding
the Program. The report shall include the following:

- 16 (1) An assessment of employment rates for
  17 military spouses that identifies—
- 18 (A) the career fields most military spouses19 frequently pursue; and
- 20 (B) the extent to which such rates may be
  21 improved by expanding the Program to include
  22 reimbursements for licensing reciprocity.

23 (2) An assessment of costs required to expand
24 the Program as described in paragraph (1)(B).
