## A BILL

To prevent Federal agencies from interfering with the marijuana policy of States.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "State Cannabis Com-
- 5 merce Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. STATES MARIJUANA POLICY.
- 7 (a) Definitions.—In this Act:

| 12 | (b) Prohibitions.—No funds authorized or appro-            |
| 13 | priated by Federal law, and none of the funds in any trust |
| 14 | fund to which funds are authorized or appropriated by      |
| 15 | Federal law, shall be expended to prevent any State from   |
| 16 | implementing any law of the State that—                    |
| 17 | (1) authorizes the use, distribution, possession,          |
| 18 | or cultivation of marijuana on non-Federal land in         |
| 19 | the State; or  |
| 20 | (2) authorizes the transportation of marijuana             |
| 21 | across the border of the State if—                         |
| 22 | (A) the State from which the marijuana is                  |
| 23 | transported has a State law described in para-             |
| 24 | graph (1); and   |

1 (B) the State and the State from which 2 the marijuana is transported have both author-3 ized such transportation of marijuana between 4 the States.
