A BILL

- To require the Corps of Engineers to carry out an assessment of the resiliency of the Great Lakes coastline, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Great Lakes Coastal
 - 5 Resiliency Act of 2019".

1 SEC. 2. GREAT LAKES COASTAL RESILIENCY STUDY.

2 (a) STUDY.—The Secretary shall carry out an assess3 ment, under section 729 of the Water Resources Develop4 ment Act of 1986 (33 U.S.C. 2267a), of the resiliency of
5 the Great Lakes coastline, with a focus on—

6 (1) areas specifically vulnerable to rising water7 levels and severe weather; and

8 (2) lake conditions that contribute to coastal 9 erosion, sustained flooding, and damage to critical 10 infrastructure and residential and commercial prop-11 erties.

(b) CONSULTATION.—The Secretary shall consult
with the Director of the Office of Management and Budget
in determining the scope of the assessment under subsection (a).

16 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
17 of enactment of this section, the Secretary shall submit
18 to Congress a report containing—

19 (1) the results of the assessment carried out20 under subsection (a); and

21 (2) any recommendations resulting from such22 assessment, which shall—

23 (A) take into account watershed sediment24 loading; and

1	(B) include recommendations to improve
2	the resiliency of the Great Lakes coastline to
3	rising water levels and severe weather.
4	(d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
5	(1) GREAT LAKES COASTLINE.—The term
6	"Great Lakes coastline" means the shoreline along
7	the five Great Lakes and their connecting channels
8	in the states of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Min-
9	nesota, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Wis-
10	consin.
11	(2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
12	the Secretary of the Army, acting through the Chief

13 of Engineers.

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
