- 3 SECTION 1. APPEAL OF ORDER GRANTING A NATIONWIDE
- 4 **INJUNCTION.**
- 5 (a) In General.—Chapter 155 of title 28, United
- 6 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 7 lowing:

### 1 "§ 2285. Appeal of order granting a nationwide in-

- 2 junction
- 3 "(a) In General.—In the case that a district court
- 4 of the United States grants a nationwide injunction, the
- 5 appeal from the order granting such injunction shall lie
- 6 to the Supreme Court.
- 7 "(b) Definition.—In this section, the term 'nation-
- 8 wide injunction' means an order issued by a Federal court
- 9 that purports to restrain the enforcement of a Federal
- 10 statute, regulation, order, or similar authority against a
- 11 non-party, unless the non-party is represented by a party
- 12 acting in a representative capacity pursuant to the Federal
- 13 Rules of Civil Procedure.".
- 14 (b) Clerical Amendment.—The table of sections
- 15 for chapter 155 of title 28, United States Code is amended
- 16 by inserting after the item relating to section 2285 the
- 17 following:

"2285. Appeal of order granting a nationwide injunction.".
