# H. R. 4432

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## AN ACT

To require the Department of Homeland Security to prepare a terrorism threat assessment relating to unmanned aircraft systems, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2   *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2       This Act may be cited as the “Protecting Critical In-  
3 frastructure Against Drones and Emerging Threats Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. DRONE AND EMERGING THREAT ASSESSMENT.**

5       (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 120 days after the  
6 date of enactment of this Act, the Under Secretary for  
7 Intelligence and Analysis of the Department of Homeland  
8 Security shall—

9           (1) in consultation with other relevant officials  
10       of the Department, request additional information  
11       from other agencies of the Federal Government,  
12       State and local government agencies, and the private  
13       sector relating to threats of unmanned aircraft sys-  
14       tems and other emerging threats associated with  
15       such new technologies;

16           (2) in consultation with relevant officials of the  
17       Department and other appropriate agencies of the  
18       Federal Government, develop and disseminate a se-  
19       curity threat assessment regarding unmanned air-  
20       craft systems and other emerging threats associated  
21       with such new technologies; and

22           (3) establish and utilize, in conjunction with the  
23       Chief Information Officer of the Department and  
24       other relevant entities, a secure communications and  
25       information technology infrastructure, including  
26       data-mining and other advanced analytical tools, in

1       order to access, receive, and analyze data and infor-  
2       mation in furtherance of the responsibilities under  
3       this section, including by establishing a voluntary  
4       mechanism whereby critical infrastructure owners  
5       and operators may report information on emerging  
6       threats, such as the threat posed by unmanned air-  
7       craft systems.

8       (b) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date  
9       of the enactment of this Act, the Under Secretary for In-  
10      telligence and Analysis of the Department of Homeland  
11      Security shall prepare a threat assessment and report to  
12      the Committee on Homeland Security of the House of  
13      Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security  
14      and Governmental Affairs of the Senate on the threat  
15      posed by unmanned aircraft systems, including informa-  
16      tion collected from critical infrastructure owners and oper-  
17      ators and Federal, State, and local government agencies.  
18      Such assessment and report shall also include a classified  
19      plan to mitigate such threat, as appropriate.

20      (c) DEFINITIONS.—

21           (1) CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE.—The term  
22      “critical infrastructure” has the meaning given such  
23      term in section 1016(e) of Public Law 107–56 (42  
24      U.S.C. 5195c(e)).

1           (2) UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM.—The term  
2       “unmanned aircraft system” has the meaning given  
3       such term in section 331 of the FAA Modernization  
4       and Reform Act of 2012 (49 U.S.C. 40101 note;  
5       Public Law 112–95).
