AN ACT

To extend the Undertaking Spam, Spyware, And Fraud Enforcement With Enforcers beyond Borders Act of 2006, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF THE U.S. SAFE WEB ACT OF 2006.**

2 Section 13 of the U.S. SAFE WEB Act of 2006
3 (Public Law 109–455; 15 U.S.C. 44 note) is amended by
4 striking “September 30, 2020” and inserting “September
5 30, 2027”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPORT.**

7 Not later than 3 years after the date of the enact-
8 ment of this Act, the Federal Trade Commission shall
9 transmit to the Committee on Energy and Commerce of
10 the House of Representatives and the Committee on Com-
11 merce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate a report
12 describing its use of and experience with the authority
13 granted by the U.S. SAFE WEB Act of 2006 (Public Law
14 109–455) and the amendments made by such Act. The
15 report shall include—

16 (1) the number of cross-border complaints re-
17 ceived and acted upon by the Commission;

18 (2) identification of the foreign agencies with
19 which the Commission has cooperated and the re-
20 sults of such cooperation, including any foreign
21 agency enforcement action or lack thereof;

22 (3) a description of Commission litigation
23 brought in foreign courts and the results of such liti-
24 gation; and

25 (4) any recommendations for legislation that
26 may advance the mission of the Commission in car-

1 rying out the U.S. SAFE WEB Act of 2006 and the
2 amendments made by such Act.

3 **SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.**

4 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of
5 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,
6 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement
7 titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this
8 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record
9 by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, pro-
10 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the
11 vote on passage.
