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## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Defense to conduct a study on the renovation, repair, or expansion needs of certain elementary schools and secondary schools that educate dependants of active duty military personnel.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Survey Our Military  
5 Impacted Schools Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT ON CONSTRUCTION GRANT**  
2 **PROGRAM.**

3 Not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment  
4 of this Act, the Secretary of Defense, in consultation with  
5 the heads of any other relevant agencies, shall conduct a  
6 study and submit a report on such study to Congress on  
7 the unmet capital improvement needs (including renova-  
8 tion, repair, or expansion needs) of each elementary school  
9 and secondary school—

10 (1) in which the total student enrollment for  
11 the most recent school year was not less than 150  
12 students;

13 (2) that is not located within the boundaries of  
14 a Federal military installation; and

15 (3) that is served by a local educational agen-  
16 cy—

17 (A) in which at least 15 percent, but not  
18 more than 40 percent, of the total student en-  
19 rollment for the most recent school year in  
20 schools of the agency were children described in  
21 subparagraphs (B) and (D)(i) of section  
22 7003(a)(1) of the Elementary and Secondary  
23 Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7703(a)(1));

1                   (B) that is eligible for assistance under  
2                   title VII of the Elementary and Secondary Edu-  
3                   cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7701 et seq.).

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
