AN ACT

To amend the Small Business Act to provide re-entry entrepreneurship counseling and training services for formerly incarcerated individuals, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.** 2 This Act may be cited as the "Prison to Proprietor-3 ship for Formerly Incarcerated Act". SEC. 2. RE-ENTRY ENTREPRENEURSHIP COUNSELING AND 4 5 TRAINING FOR FORMERLY INCARCERATED 6 INDIVIDUALS. 7 The Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 631 et seq.) is 8 amended-9 (1) by redesignating section 49 as section 50; 10 and 11 (2) by inserting after section 48 the following 12 new section: 13 "SEC. 49. RE-ENTRY ENTREPRENEURSHIP COUNSELING 14 AND TRAINING FOR FORMERLY INCARCER-15 ATED INDIVIDUALS. 16 "(a) SERVICES REQUIRED.—The Administrator, in coordination with the Director of the Bureau of Prisons, 17 shall require the Service Corps of Retired Executives to 18 19 provide entrepreneurship counseling and training services to individuals formerly incarcerated in a Federal prison 20 21 (hereinafter referred to as 'covered individuals') on a na-22 tionwide basis.

23 "(b) GOALS.—The goal of the services provided under
24 this section is to provide covered individuals with the fol25 lowing:

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| 1 | "(1) Mentoring, workshops, and instructional |
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| 2 | videos designed specifically for covered individuals |
| 3 | on how to start or expand a small business concern. |
| 4 | "(2) Tools, skills, and knowledge necessary to |
| 5 | identify a business opportunity, including how to— |
| 6 | "(A) draft a skills profile, business plan, |
| 7 | and transition plan; |
| 8 | "(B) identify sources of capital; and |
| 9 | "(C) connect with local resources for small |
| 10 | business concerns. |
| 11 | "(c) Additional Requirements.—The services |
| 12 | provided under this section shall include— |
| 13 | "(1) regular individualized mentoring sessions, |
| 14 | to take place over the course of a year, to support |
| 15 | development of the business plans of covered individ- |
| 16 | uals and the growth of covered individuals as entre- |
| 17 | preneurs; |
| 18 | ((2) assistance with identifying of local re- |
| 19 | sources for small business concerns for covered indi- |
| 20 | viduals; |
| 21 | "(3) assistance with identifying sources of cap- |
| 22 | ital, and when appropriate, assistance with pre- |
| 23 | paring applications for loans and other funding op- |
| 24 | portunities; and |

"(4) workshops on topics specifically tailored to
 meet the needs of covered individuals.

3 "(d) SURVEY.—The Service Corps of Retired Execu4 tives shall survey covered individuals who received services
5 under this section to assess the satisfaction of such cov6 ered individuals with such services.

"(e) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date 7 8 of the enactment of this section and annually thereafter, 9 the Administrator shall submit to the Committee on Small 10 Business of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship of the 11 Senate a report on the performance and effectiveness of 12 the services provided under this section, which may be in-13 cluded as part of another report submitted to such com-14 15 mittees by the Administrator, and which shall include— **((1)** 16 the number of covered individuals

17 mentored under this section;

18 "(2) the number of hours of mentorship pro19 vided by the Service Corps of Retired Executives
20 under this section;

21 "(3) the demographics of covered individuals
22 who received services, including age, gender, race,
23 and ethnicity;

24 "(4) a summary and analysis of surveys con-25 ducted under subsection (d); and

"(5) any additional information the Adminis trator may require.".
