#### 116TH CONGRESS 2D SESSION H.R. 5078

### AN ACT

To amend the Small Business Act to provide re-entry entrepreneurship counseling and training services for incarcerated individuals, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Prison to Proprietor-3 ship Act".

SEC. 2. RE-ENTRY ENTREPRENEURSHIP COUNSELING AND 4 5 TRAINING FOR INCARCERATED INDIVIDUALS. 6 The Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 631 et seq.) is 7 amended-8 (1) by redesignating section 49 as section 50; 9 and 10 (2) by inserting after section 48 the following 11 new section: 12 "SEC. 49. RE-ENTRY ENTREPRENEURSHIP COUNSELING 13 AND TRAINING FOR INCARCERATED INDIVID-14 UALS. "(a) SERVICES REQUIRED.—The Administrator, in 15 coordination with the Director of the Bureau of Prisons, 16 17 shall require women's business centers and small business development centers identified under the plan described in 18 19 subsection (b) to provide entrepreneurship counseling and 20 training services to covered individuals. 21 "(b) PLAN.— "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator, in con-22 23 sultation with an association formed to pursue mat-24 ters of common concern to women's business centers 25 and an association of small business development

26 centers formed pursuant to section 21(a)(3)(A),

shall develop a plan, which shall be updated annually, to match women's business centers and small
business development centers with covered individuals in Federal prisons who are eligible to receive
services under this section.

6 (2)MATCHING.—In determining matches under paragraph (1), the Administrator 7 shall 8 prioritize matching the women's business center or 9 small business development center in closest prox-10 imity to the applicable Federal prison to provide 11 such services.

12 "(3) Association responsibilities.—If the women's business center or small business develop-13 14 ment center identified under the plan in paragraph 15 (1) is unable to provide such services to covered in-16 dividuals in such Federal prison, another women's 17 business center or small business development cen-18 ter, an association of women's business centers, or 19 an association of small business development centers 20 shall provide such services in accordance with the re-21 quirements of this section.

"(c) GOALS.—The goal of the services provided under
this section is to provide covered individuals with the following:

1	"(1) Assistance and in-depth training on how to
2	start or expand a small business concern.
3	"(2) Tools, skills, and knowledge necessary to
4	identify a business opportunity, including how to—
5	"(A) draft a resume, business plan, and
6	transition plan;
7	"(B) identify sources of capital; and
8	"(C) connect with local resources for small
9	business concerns.
10	"(d) Additional Requirements.—The services
11	provided under this section shall include—
12	"(1) a presentation providing exposure to the
13	opportunities involved in self-employment and own-
14	ership of a small business concern;
15	"(2) a self-study course manual focused on the
16	basic skills of entrepreneurship, financial literacy,
17	the language of business, and the considerations and
18	life skills relevant to self-employment and ownership
19	of a small business concern;
20	"(3) five two-day sessions of in-depth classroom
21	instruction introducing the foundations of self-em-
22	ployment and ownership of small business concerns,
23	including guided discussions to explore personal en-
24	trepreneurial development interests;

"(4) in-depth training delivered through one-on one mentorship, including individual support in the
 development of a business plan, entrepreneurial
 skills, and strategies for starting up a small business
 concern; and

6 "(5) upon completion of the counseling and7 training, a presentation of a certificate.

8 "(e) PRIORITY.—The Administrator shall, to the ex-9 tent practicable, ensure that women's business centers and 10 small business development centers prioritize providing en-11 trepreneurship counseling and training services to covered 12 individuals who will be released from Federal custody not 13 later than 18 months after the date on which such a cov-14 ered individual begins to receive such services.

"(f) CONTINUATION OF SERVICES.—A covered indi-15 vidual receiving services under this section may continue 16 to receive such services after release from Federal custody. 17 18 "(g) GRANT AUTHORITY.—In carrying out this section, the Administrator may, subject to appropriation, 19 20 award a grant to an association formed to pursue matters 21 of common concern to women's business centers or small 22 business development centers to coordinate the services

24 riculum, train mentors and instructors, and establish pub-

described under this section, including to develop cur-

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lic-private partnerships to support covered individuals and
 identify opportunities to access capital.

3 "(h) CURRICULUM.—The Administration shall print 4 and make available to women's business centers, small 5 business development centers, an association of women's 6 business centers, or an association of small business devel-7 opment centers any curriculum or course materials devel-8 oped pursuant to this section.

9 "(i) SURVEY.—Each women's business center or 10 small business development center that provided services 11 under this section shall survey covered individuals who re-12 ceived such services to assess the satisfaction of such cov-13 ered individuals with such services.

"(j) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date 14 15 of the enactment of this section and annually thereafter, the Administrator shall submit to the Committee on Small 16 Business of the House of Representatives and the Com-17 mittee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship of the 18 19 Senate a report on the performance and effectiveness of 20 the services provided under this section, which may be in-21 cluded as part of another report submitted to such com-22 mittees by the Administrator, and which shall include— "(1) the number of covered individuals coun-23 24seled or trained under this section;

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1	"(2) the number of hours of counseling pro-
2	vided by each women's business center and each
3	small business development center under this sec-
4	tion;
5	"(3) the number of certificates presented under
6	subsection $(d)(5);$
7	"(4) the demographics of covered individuals
8	who received services, including age, gender, race,
9	and ethnicity;
10	"(5) the level of understanding of business con-
11	cepts of covered individuals upon completion of the
12	counseling and training described under this section;
13	"(6) a summary and analysis of surveys con-
14	ducted under subsection (i); and
15	"(7) any additional information the Adminis-
16	trator may require.
17	"(k) Covered Individual Defined.—In this sec-
18	tion, the term 'covered individual' means an individual in-
19	carcerated in a Federal prison that the Director of the
20	Bureau of Prisons has designated as a minimum, low, or
21	medium security prison.
22	"(l) FUNDING.—Subject to the availability of appro-
23	priations, the Administrator shall reimburse women's
24	business centers, small business development centers, an
25	association of women's business centers, or an association
