AN ACT

To establish a program to facilitate the adoption of modern technology by executive agencies, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Information Tech-
- 3 nology Modernization Centers of Excellence Program
- 4 Act".

5 SEC. 2. GSA MODERNIZATION CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE

- 6 PROGRAM.
- 7 (a) Definitions.—In this section:
- 8 (1) CLOUD COMPUTING.—The term "cloud
- 9 computing" has the meaning given the term in sec-
- tion 1076 of the National Defense Authorization Act
- 11 for Fiscal Year 2018 (40 U.S.C. 11301 note).
- 12 (2) EXECUTIVE AGENCY.—The term "executive
- agency" has the meaning given the term "Executive
- agency" in section 105 of title 5, United States
- 15 Code.
- 16 (3) Program.—The term "Program" means
- the Information Technology Modernization Centers
- of Excellence Program established under subsection
- 19 (b).
- 20 (b) Establishment.—The Administrator of General
- 21 Services shall establish a program to be known as the In-
- 22 formation Technology Modernization Centers of Excel-
- 23 lence Program to facilitate the adoption of modern tech-
- 24 nology by executive agencies on a reimbursable basis.
- (c) RESPONSIBILITIES.—The Program shall have the
- 26 following responsibilities:

1	(1) To encourage the modernization of informa-
2	tion technology used by an executive agency and how
3	a customer interacts with an executive agency.
4	(2) To improve cooperation between commercial
5	and executive agency information technology sectors.
6	(3) To the extent practicable, encourage the
7	adoption of commercial items in accordance with
8	section 3307 of title 41, United States Code.
9	(4) Upon request by the executive agency, to
10	assist executive agencies with planning and adoption
11	of technology in focus areas designated by the Ad-
12	ministrator, which may include the following:
13	(A) A commercial cloud computing system
14	that includes—
15	(i) end-to-end migration planning and
16	an assessment of progress towards mod-
17	ernization; and
18	(ii) a cybersecurity and governance
19	framework that promotes industry and
20	government risk management best practice
21	approaches, prioritizing efforts based on
22	risk, impact, and consequences.
23	(B) Tools to help an individual receive sup-
24	port from and communicate with an executive
25	agency.

1	(C) Contact centers and other related cus-					
2	tomer supports.					
3	(D) Efficient use of data management,					
4	analysis, and reporting.					
5	(E) The optimization of infrastructure, in-					
6	cluding for data centers, and the reduction of					
7	operating costs.					
8	(F) Artificial intelligence.					
9	(5) To share best practices and expertise with					
10	executive agencies.					
11	(6) Other responsibilities the Administrator					
12	may identify.					
13	(d) Coordination.—The Administrator shall coordi-					
14	nate with the Secretary of Homeland Security in estab-					
15	lishing the Program to ensure that the technology, tools,					
16	and frameworks facilitated for executive agencies by the					
17	Program provide sufficient cybersecurity and maintain the					
18	integrity, confidentiality, and availability of Federal infor-					
19	mation.					
20	(e) Program Reporting.—Not later than 1 year					
21	after the date of enactment of this Act, and every year					
22	thereafter, the Administrator shall submit to the Com-					
23	mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs					
24	of the Senate and the Committee on Oversight and Re-					

- 1 form of the House of Representatives a report on the Pro-
- 2 gram, which shall include the following:
- 3 (1) A description of the reimbursable agree-
- 4 ments, statements of work, and associated project
- 5 schedules and deliverables for the Program.
- 6 (2) Details on the total amount of the reim-
- 7 bursable agreements.
- 8 (3) Any additional information the Adminis-
- 9 trator determines necessary.
- 10 (f) Sunset.—This Act shall cease to have effect on
- 11 the date that is 7 years after the date of enactment of
- 12 this Act.
- 13 (g) Rule of Construction.—Nothing in this Act
- 14 shall be construed to impair or otherwise affect the au-
- 15 thority delegated by law to an executive agency or the head
- 16 of an executive agency.
- 17 SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.
- 18 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of
- 19 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,
- 20 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement
- 21 titled "Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation" for this
- 22 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record
- 23 by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, pro-

- 1 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the
- 2 vote on passage.
