## A BILL

To promote international exchanges on best election practices, cultivate more secure democratic institutions around the world, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Global Electoral Ex-  
5       change Act of 2019”.

6       **SEC. 2. SENSE OF CONGRESS.**

7       It is the sense of Congress that—

8                   (1) recent elections globally have illustrated the  
9                   urgent need for the promotion and exchange of  
10                  international best election practices, particularly in

1       the areas of cybersecurity, results transmission,  
2       transparency of electoral data, election dispute reso-  
3       lution, and the elimination of discriminatory reg-  
4       istration practices and other electoral irregularities;

5               (2) the advancement of democracy worldwide  
6       promotes American interests, as stable democracies  
7       provide new market opportunities, improve global  
8       health outcomes, and promote economic freedom and  
9       regional security;

10              (3) credible elections are the cornerstone of a  
11       healthy democracy and enable all persons to exercise  
12       their basic human right to have a say in how they  
13       are governed;

14              (4) inclusive elections strengthen the credibility  
15       and stability of democracies more broadly;

16              (5) at the heart of a strong election cycle is the  
17       professionalism of the election management body  
18       and an empowered civil society;

19              (6) the development of local expertise via peer-  
20       to-peer learning and exchanges promotes the inde-  
21       pendence of such bodies from internal and external  
22       influence; and

23              (7) supporting the efforts of peoples in democ-  
24       ratizing societies to build more representative gov-

1       ernments in their respective countries is in the na-  
2       tional interest of the United States.

3 **SEC. 3. GLOBAL ELECTORAL EXCHANGE.**

4       (a) **GLOBAL ELECTORAL EXCHANGE.**—The Sec-  
5       retary of State is authorized to establish and administer  
6       a Global Electoral Exchange Program to promote the utili-  
7       zation of sound election administration practices around  
8       the world.

9       (b) **PURPOSE.**—The purpose of the Global Electoral  
10      Exchange Program described in subsection (a) shall in-  
11      clude the promotion and exchange of international best  
12      election practices, including in the areas of—

- 13               (1) cybersecurity;
- 14               (2) results transmission;
- 15               (3) transparency of electoral data;
- 16               (4) election dispute resolution;
- 17               (5) the elimination of discriminatory regis-  
18        tration practices and electoral irregularities;
- 19               (6) equitable access to polling places, voter edu-  
20        cation information, and voting mechanisms (includ-  
21        ing by persons with disabilities); and
- 22               (7) other sound election administration prac-  
23        tices.

24       (c) **EXCHANGE OF ELECTORAL AUTHORITIES.**—



(B) To design and implement programs taking the United States or another country's election administrators and officials, including government officials, poll workers, civil society representatives, members of the judiciary, and others who participate in the organization and administration of public elections to study and discuss election procedures for educational purposes.

19 (C) be carried out without proper consulta-  
20 tion with State and local authorities in the  
21 United States that administer elections.

22                             (4) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of  
23                             Congress that the Secretary of State should estab-  
24                             lish and maintain a network of Global Electoral Ex-  
25                             change Program alumni, to promote communication

1 and further exchange of information regarding  
2 sound election administration practices among cur-  
3 rent and former program participants.

4 (5) FURTHER LIMITS.—A recipient of a grant  
5 under the Global Electoral Exchange Program may  
6 use such grant for only the purpose for which such  
7 grant was awarded, unless otherwise authorized by  
8 the Secretary of State.

9 (6) NOT DUPLICATIVE.—Grants made under  
10 this subsection may not be duplicative of any other  
11 grants made under any other provision of law for  
12 similar or related purposes.

13 **SEC. 4. CONGRESSIONAL OVERSIGHT.**

14 Not later than one year after the date of the enact-  
15 ment of this Act and in each of the following two years  
16 thereafter, the Secretary of State shall provide to the  
17 Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representa-  
18 tives and the Committee on Foreign Relations of the Sen-  
19 ate a briefing on the status of any activities carried out  
20 pursuant to this Act during the preceding year, which  
21 shall include, among other information, the following:

22 (1) A summary of all exchanges conducted  
23 under the Global Electoral Exchange Program, in-  
24 cluding information regarding grantees, participants,  
25 and the locations where program activities were held.

1                   (2) A description of the criteria used to select  
2                   grantees under the Global Electoral Exchange Pro-  
3                   gram.

4                   (3) Any recommendations for the improvement  
5                   of the Global Electoral Exchange Program, based on  
6                   the purpose specified in section 3(b).

7 **SEC. 5. NO ADDITIONAL FUNDS AUTHORIZED.**

8                   No additional funds are authorized to be appro-  
9                   priated to carry out the requirements of this Act. Such  
10                  requirements shall be carried out using amounts otherwise  
11                  authorized to be appropriated.
