Mr. KELLY of Mississippi submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration

RESOLUTION

Establishing the Congressional Gold Star Fellowship Program for the placement in offices of Members of the House of Representatives of children, spouses, and siblings of members of the Armed Forces who are hostile casualties or who have died from a training-related injury.

1 *Resolved,*

2 **SECTION 1. CONGRESSIONAL GOLD STAR FELLOWSHIP**
3 **PROGRAM.**

4 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established in the
5 House of Representatives the Congressional Gold Star
6 Fellowship Program (hereafter in this resolution referred

1 to as the “Program”) under which, under the direction
2 of the Chief Administrative Officer of the House of Rep-
3 resentatives, an eligible individual may serve a 12-month
4 fellowship in the office of a Member of the House of Rep-
5 resentatives (including a Delegate or Resident Commis-
6 sioner to the Congress).

7 (b) EXCLUSION OF APPOINTEES FOR PURPOSES OF
8 LIMIT ON NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES IN MEMBER OF-
9 FICES.—Any individual serving a fellowship under the
10 Program in the office of a Member shall not be included
11 in the determination of the number of employees employed
12 by the Member under section 104(a) of the House of Rep-
13 resentatives Administrative Reform Technical Corrections
14 Act (2 U.S.C. 5321(a)).

15 (c) PLACEMENT IN MEMBER OFFICES IN DISTRICT
16 OF COLUMBIA OR CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT OF MEM-
17 BER.—An individual may serve a fellowship under the
18 Program at the Member’s office in the District of Colum-
19 bia or the Member’s office in the congressional district the
20 Member represents.

21 (d) ELIGIBILITY.—

22 (1) IN GENERAL.—An individual is eligible to
23 serve a fellowship under the Program if the indi-
24 vidual is the child (including a stepchild), spouse, or
25 sibling of a member of the Armed Forces who is a

1 hostile casualty or died from a training-related in-
2 jury.

3 (2) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection, the
4 terms “hostile casualty” and “training-related in-
5 jury” have the meanings given those terms in sec-
6 tion 2402(b) of title 38, United States Code.

7 (e) REGULATIONS.—The Program shall be carried
8 out in accordance with regulations promulgated by the
9 Committee on House Administration.

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
