- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "Repeal CFPB Act".
- 5 SEC. 2. REPEAL.
- 6 The Consumer Financial Protection Act of 2010 (12
- 7 U.S.C. 5481 et seq.) is repealed, and the provisions of law
- 8 amended or repealed by that Act are restored or revived
- 9 as if the Act had not been enacted.
