AMENDMENT:

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert:

	TIVITY INDEX PRODUCTS GENERALLY.—Subject to the
3	availability of appropriations and the priorities set forth
4	in subsection (c), the Under Secretary shall—
5	(1) periodically update the environmental sensi-
6	tivity index products of the Administration; and
7	(2) endeavor to do so not less frequently than
8	once every 7 years.
9	(c) PRIORITIES.—When prioritizing geographic areas
10	to update environmental sensitivity index products, the
11	Under Secretary shall consider—
12	(1) the age of existing environmental sensitivity
13	index products for the areas;
14	(2) the occurrence of extreme events, be it natural
15	or man-made, which have significantly altered the
16	shoreline or ecosystem since the last update;
17	(3) the natural variability of shoreline and
18	coastal environment; and
19	(4) the volume of vessel traffic and general vul-
20	nerability to spilled pollutants.
21	(d) Environmental Sensitivity Index Product
22	Defined.—In this section, the term "environmental sensi-
23	tivity index product" means a map or similar tool that
24	is utilized to identify sensitive shoreline, coastal or offshore,
25	resources prior to an oil spill event in order to set baseline

priorities for protection and plan cleanup strategies, typi cally including information relating to shoreline type, bio logical resources, and human use resources.

4 (e) FUNDING.—Funds to carry out the activities under
5 this section shall be derived from amounts authorized to be
6 appropriated for the Under Secretary that are enacted after
7 the date of the enactment of this Act.
