## A BILL

To require the Under Secretary for Oceans and Atmosphere to update periodically the environmental sensitivity index products of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration for each coastal area of the Great Lakes, and for other purposes.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Great Lakes Environ-

1	SEC. 2. UPDATE TO ENVIRONMENTAL SENSITIVITY INDEX
2	PRODUCTS OF NATIONAL OCEANIC AND AT
3	MOSPHERIC ADMINISTRATION FOR GREAT
4	LAKES.
5	(a) Update Required for Environmental Sen-
6	SITIVITY INDEX PRODUCTS FOR GREAT LAKES.—Not
7	later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of
8	this Act, the Under Secretary for Oceans and Atmosphere
9	shall commence updating the environmental sensitivity
10	index products of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric
11	Administration for each coastal area of the Great Lakes
12	(b) Periodic Updates for Environmental Sen-
13	SITIVITY INDEX PRODUCTS GENERALLY.—Subject to the
14	availability of appropriations and the priorities set forth
15	in subsection (c), the Under Secretary shall—
16	(1) periodically update the environmental sensi-
17	tivity index products of the Administration; and
18	(2) endeavor to do so not less frequently than
19	once every 7 years.
20	(c) Priorities.—When prioritizing geographic areas
21	to update environmental sensitivity index products, the
22	Under Secretary shall consider—
23	(1) the age of existing environmental sensitivity
24	index products for the areas:

1	(2) the occurrence of extreme events, be it nat-
2	ural or man-made, which have significantly altered
3	the shoreline or ecosystem since the last update;
4	(3) the natural variability of shoreline and
5	coastal environment; and
6	(4) the volume of vessel traffic and general vul-
7	nerability to spilled pollutants.
8	(d) Environmental Sensitivity Index Product
9	DEFINED.—In this section, the term "environmental sen-
10	sitivity index product" means a map or similar tool that
11	is utilized to identify sensitive shoreline, coastal or off-
12	shore, resources prior to an oil spill event in order to set
13	baseline priorities for protection and plan cleanup strate-
14	gies, typically including information relating to shoreline
15	type, biological resources, and human use resources.
16	(e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—
17	(1) In general.—There is authorized to be
18	appropriated to the Under Secretary \$7,500,000 to
19	carry out subsection (a).
20	(2) Availability.—Amounts appropriated or
21	otherwise made available pursuant to paragraph (1)
22	shall be available to the Under Secretary for the
23	purposes set forth in such paragraph until expended.
