 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Bureau of Consumer

 - 6 the "CFPB-IG Act".
 - 7 SEC. 2. APPOINTMENT OF INSPECTOR GENERAL.

16	(B) in paragraph (2), by inserting "the
17	Bureau of Consumer Financial Protection,"
18	after "the Export-Import Bank,".
