## A BILL

To double the existing penalties for the provision of misleading or inaccurate caller identification information, and to extend the statute of limitations for forfeiture penalties for persons who commit such violations.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Anti-Spoofing Pen-  
5 alties Modernization Act of 2019”.

1 **SEC. 2. INCREASING PENALTIES AND EXTENDING STATUTE**  
2 **OF LIMITATIONS FOR SPOOFERS.**

3 (a) INCREASING PENALTIES.—Section 227(e)(5) of  
4 the Communications Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 227(e)(5))  
5 is amended—

6 (1) in subparagraph (A)(i)—

7 (A) by striking “\$10,000” and inserting  
8 “\$20,000”; and

9 (B) by striking “\$1,000,000” and insert-  
10 ing “\$2,000,000”; and

11 (2) in subparagraph (B), by striking “\$10,000”  
12 and inserting “\$20,000”.

13 (b) EXTENDING STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS.—Clause  
14 (iv) of section 227(e)(5)(A) of the Communications Act  
15 of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 227(e)(5)(A)) is amended—

16 (1) in the heading, by striking “2-YEAR” and  
17 inserting “3-YEAR”; and

18 (2) by striking “2 years” and inserting “3  
19 years”.
