## A BILL

To ensure that the Secretary of the Interior collaborates fully with State and local authorities and certain nonprofit entities in managing the Corolla Wild Horse population on Federal land.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. WILD HORSES IN AND AROUND THE CURRI-4 TUCK NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE.

5 (a) GENETIC DIVERSITY.—The Secretary of the Inte6 rior (referred to in this section as the "Secretary"), in con7 sultation with the North Carolina Department of Environ8 ment and Natural Resources, Currituck County, North

Carolina, and the Corolla Wild Horse Fund, shall allow
 for the introduction of a small number of free-roaming
 wild horses from the Cape Lookout National Seashore as
 necessary to ensure the genetic diversity of the wild horse
 population in and around the Currituck National Wildlife
 Refuge, consistent with—

7 (1) the laws (including regulations) applicable
8 to the Currituck National Wildlife Refuge and the
9 Cape Lookout National Seashore; and

(2) the December 2014 Wild Horse Management Agreement approved by the United States Fish
and Wildlife Service, the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources,
Currituck County, North Carolina, and the Corolla
Wild Horse Fund.

16 (b) AGREEMENT.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may enter
into an agreement with the Corolla Wild Horse
Fund to provide for the cost-effective management
of the horses in and around the Currituck National
Wildlife Refuge while ensuring that natural resources within the Currituck National Wildlife Refuge are not adversely impacted.

24 (2) REQUIREMENTS.—The agreement entered
25 into under paragraph (1) shall specify that the Co-

1	rolla Wild Horse Fund shall pay the costs associated
2	with, with respect to the horses in and around the
3	Currituck National Wildlife Refuge—
4	(A) coordinating and conducting a periodic
5	census, and inspecting the health, of the horses;
6	(B) maintaining records of the horses liv-
7	ing in the wild and in confinement;
8	(C) coordinating and conducting the re-
9	moval and placement of horses and monitoring
10	of any horses removed from the Currituck
11	County Outer Banks; and
12	(D) administering a viable population con-
13	trol plan for the horses, including auctions,
14	adoptions, contraceptive fertility methods, and
15	other viable options.

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
