Mr. BLUNT (for himself and Ms. KLOBUCHAR) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was considered and agreed to

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the printing of a commemorative document in memory of the late President of the United States, George Herbert Walker Bush.

1 *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. COMMEMORATIVE DOCUMENT AUTHORIZED.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—A commemorative document in
5 memory of the late President of the United States, George
6 Herbert Walker Bush, shall be printed as a House docu-
7 ment, with illustrations and suitable binding, under the
8 direction of the Joint Committee on Printing.

9 (b) CONTENTS.—The document shall consist of the
10 eulogies and encomiums for George Herbert Walker Bush,

1 as expressed in the Senate and the House of Representa-
2 tives, together with the texts of each of the following:

3 (1) The state funeral ceremony at the United
4 States Capitol Rotunda.

5 (2) The national funeral service held at the
6 Washington National Cathedral, Washington, Dis-
7 trict of Columbia.

8 (3) The memorial service held at St. Martin's
9 Episcopal Church, Houston, Texas.

10 (4) The interment ceremony at the George Her-
11 bert Walker Bush Presidential Library Center, Col-
12 lege Station, Texas.

13 **SEC. 2. PRINTING OF DOCUMENT.**

14 In addition to the usual number of copies printed,
15 there shall be printed the lesser of—

16 (1) 32,500 copies of the commemorative docu-
17 ment, of which 22,150 copies shall be for the use of
18 the House of Representatives and 10,350 copies
19 shall be for the use of the Senate; or

20 (2) such number of copies of the commemora-
21 tive document that does not exceed a production and
22 printing cost of \$1,000,000, with distribution of the
23 copies to be allocated in the same proportion as de-
24 scribed in paragraph (1).
