Families First Coronavirus Response Act: H.R. 6201, amended, making emergency supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, by a 2/3 yeas-and-nays vote of 363 yeas to 40 nays with one answering “present”, Roll No. 102. **Pages H1675–91**

Committee Ranking: The House agreed to H. Res. 903, ranking a Member of a certain standing committee of the House of Representatives. **Pages H1691–92**

Clerk to Correct Engrossment: Agreed by unanimous consent that in the engrossment of H.R. 6201, the Clerk be authorized to make technical and conforming changes to the bill. **Page H1692**

Extending the chemical facility anti-terrorism standards program of the Department of Homeland Security: The House agreed to discharge from committee and pass H.R. 6160, to extend the chem-

ical facility anti-terrorism standards program of the Department of Homeland Security. **Page H1692**

Presidential Message: Read a message from the President wherein he notified Congress of his declaration of a national emergency concerning the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID–19) outbreak—referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce and the Committee on Ways and Means and ordered to be printed (H. Doc. 116–108). **Page H1675**
