Public Bills and Resolutions Introduced: 5 public bills, H.R. 8314–8318; and 4 resolutions, H. Con. Res. 118; and H. Res. 1125–1127, were introduced.

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Reports Filed: Reports were filed today as follows:

H.R. 5053, to exempt juveniles from the requirements for suits by prisoners, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 116–515);

H.R. 4585, to require the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to conduct a national suicide prevention media campaign, and for other purposes, with amendments (H. Rept. 116–516);

H.R. 4564, to amend the Public Health Service Act to ensure the provision of high-quality service through the Suicide Prevention Lifeline, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 116–517);

H.R. 7574, to amend the Public Health Service Act with respect to the Strategic National Stockpile, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 116–518);

H.R. 1646, to require the Secretary of Health and Human Services to improve the detection, prevention, and treatment of mental health issues among public safety officers, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 116–519, Part 1);

H.R. 5619, to authorize a pilot program to expand and intensify surveillance of self-harm in partnership with State and local public health departments, to establish a grant program to provide self-

harm and suicide prevention services in hospital emergency departments, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 116–520);

H.R. 451, to repeal the section of the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012 that requires the Federal Communications Commission to reallocate and auction the T-Band spectrum, with amendments (H. Rept. 116–521);

H.R. 5918, to direct the Federal Communications Commission to issue reports after activation of the Disaster Information Reporting System and to make improvements to network outage reporting, with an amendment (H. Rept. 116–522); and

H.R. 5567, to amend the Communications Act of 1934 to require the Federal Communications Commission to consider market entry barriers for socially disadvantaged individuals in the communications marketplace report under section 13 of such Act (H. Rept. 116–523).
