PUBLIC BILLS AND RESOLUTIONS

H.R. 8399. A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to deny the deduction for advertising and promotional expenses for prescription drugs; to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Mr. FOSTER:

H.R. 8400. A bill to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to allow certain Federal student loans to be transferred from a parent to a child, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Education and Labor.

By Ms. HAALAND (for herself, Ms. MENG, Ms. BARRAGAN, Mr. ESPAILLAT, Mr. DANNY K. DAVIS of Illinois, and Ms. TLAIB):

H.R. 8401. A bill to require the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to complete an interagency report on the effects of special recreation permits on environmental justice communities, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on Agriculture, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
