AN ACT

- To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the National World War II Memorial in Washington, DC, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Greatest Generation3 Commemorative Coin Act".

4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

5 The Congress finds the following:

6 (1) The National World War II Memorial was
7 dedicated in Washington, DC, on May 29, 2004, and
8 is located on the east end of the Reflecting Pool on
9 the National Mall, opposite the Lincoln Memorial
10 and west of the Washington Monument.

11 (2) The dedication of the National World War 12 II Memorial was the culmination of a 17-year effort 13 that started on December 10, 1987 when the World 14 War II Memorial Act was first introduced in the 15 House of Representatives, and was authorized by an 16 Act of Congress signed into law on May 25, 1993. 17 Construction began September 4, 2001, after several 18 years of fundraising and public hearings.

(3) Opening to the public on April 29, 2004,
the World War II Memorial is the first national memorial dedicated to all who served during World
War II and acknowledges the commitment and
achievement of the entire Nation.

24 (4) The Memorial honors the more than
25 16,000,000 who served in the Armed Forces of the
26 United States during World War II, the more than

400,000 who died, and the millions who supported
 the war effort from home.

3 (5) It is a monument to the spirit, sacrifice,
4 and commitment of the American people to the com5 mon defense of the Nation and to the broader causes
6 of peace and freedom from tyranny throughout the
7 world.

8 (6) Today, the Memorial is a top destination for 9 millions of annual visitors from all over the country 10 and the world. For many young visitors, their visit 11 to the Memorial is a first glimpse to a grateful Na-12 tion's remembrance of the sacrifices made by the 13 World War II generation.

14 (7) For World War II veterans, the Memorial
15 is a special destination, a rendezvous point, and a
16 gathering place for reunions and commemoration
17 programs.

18 (8) The Friends of the National World War II 19 Memorial play a vital role in the preservation and 20 maintenance of the National World War II Memorial 21 as a treasure for the American people, while helping 22 to facilitate key commemorative and educational pro-23 grams at the Memorial to pay tribute to America's 24 "Greatest Generation" and their efforts to preserve 25 liberty for generations to come.

(9) The National World War II Memorial

2	stands as an important symbol of America's national
3	unity, a timeless reminder of the moral strength and
4	power that flows when free people are at once united
5	and bonded together in a common and just cause for
6	liberty.
7	SEC. 3. COIN SPECIFICATIONS.
8	(a) DENOMINATIONS.—The Secretary of the Treas-
9	ury (hereafter in this Act referred to as the "Secretary")
10	shall mint and issue the following coin:
11	(1) \$5 GOLD COINS.—Not more than 50,000
12	coins, which shall—
13	(A) weigh 8.359 grams;
14	(B) have a diameter of 0.850 inches; and
15	(C) contain not less than 90 percent gold.
16	(2) 1 SILVER COINS.—Not more than 400,000
17	\$1 coins, which shall—
18	(A) weigh 26.73 grams;
19	(B) have a diameter of 1.500 inches; and
20	(C) contain not less than 90 percent silver.
21	(3) Half-dollar clad coins.—Not more
22	than 750,000 half-dollar coins which shall—
23	(A) weigh 11.34 grams;
24	(B) have a diameter of 1.205 inches; and

(C) be minted to the specifications for half dollar coins contained in section 5112(b) of title
 31, United States Code.

4 (b) LEGAL TENDER.—The coins minted under this
5 Act shall be legal tender, as provided in section 5103 of
6 title 31, United States Code.

7 (c) NUMISMATIC ITEMS.—For purposes of sections
8 5134 and 5136 of title 31, United States Code, all coins
9 minted under this Act shall be considered to be numis10 matic items.

11 SEC. 4. DESIGNS OF COINS.

12 (a) DESIGN REQUIREMENTS.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The designs of the coins
minted under this Act shall be emblematic of the
National World War II Memorial and the service
and sacrifice of American soldiers and civilians during World War II.

18 (2) DESIGNATION AND INSCRIPTIONS.—On
19 each coin minted under this Act there shall be—

20 (A) a designation of the value of the coin;
21 (B) an inscription of the year "2024"; and
22 (C) inscriptions of the words "Liberty",
23 "In God We Trust", "United States of Amer24 ica", and "E Pluribus Unum".

(b) SELECTION.—The designs for the coins minted
 under this Act shall be—

3 (1) selected by the Secretary after consultation
4 with the Commission of Fine Arts and the Friends
5 of the National World War II Memorial; and

6 (2) reviewed by the Citizens Coinage Advisory7 Committee.

8 SEC. 5. ISSUANCE OF COINS.

9 (a) QUALITY OF COINS.—Coins minted under this10 Act shall be issued in uncirculated and proof qualities.

(b) PERIOD FOR ISSUANCE.—The Secretary may
issue coins minted under this Act only during the 1-year
period beginning on January 1, 2024.

14 SEC. 6. SALE OF COINS.

(a) SALE PRICE.—The coins issued under this Act
shall be sold by the Secretary at a price equal to the sum
of—

18 (1) the face value of the coins;

(2) the surcharge provided in section 7(a) withrespect to such coins; and

(3) the cost of designing and issuing the coins
(including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery,
overhead expenses, marketing, and shipping).

(b) BULK SALES.—The Secretary shall make bulk
 sales of the coins issued under this Act at a reasonable
 discount.

4 (c) Prepaid Orders.—

5 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall accept
6 prepaid orders for the coins minted under this Act
7 before the issuance of such coins.

8 (2) DISCOUNT.—Sale prices with respect to pre9 paid orders under paragraph (1) shall be at a rea10 sonable discount.

11 SEC. 7. SURCHARGES.

12 (a) IN GENERAL.—All sales of coins issued under this
13 Act shall include a surcharge of—

14 (1) \$35 per coin for the \$5 coin;

15 (2) \$10 per coin for the \$1 coin; and

16 (3) \$5 per coin for the half-dollar coin.

17 (b) DISTRIBUTION.—Subject to section 5134(f) of title 31, United States Code, all surcharges received by 18 the Secretary from the sale of coins issued under this Act 19 shall be promptly paid by the Secretary to the Friends 2021 of the National World War II Memorial to support the 22 National Park Service in maintaining and repairing the 23 National World War II Memorial, and for educational and 24 commemorative programs.

(c) AUDITS.—The Friends of the National World
 War II Memorial shall be subject to the audit require ments of section 5134(f)(2) of title 31, United States
 Code, with regard to the amounts received under sub section (b).

6 (d) LIMITATION.—Notwithstanding subsection (a), 7 no surcharge may be included with respect to the issuance 8 under this Act of any coin during a calendar year if, as 9 of the time of such issuance, the issuance of such coin 10 would result in the number of commemorative coin programs issued during such year to exceed the annual 2 11 12 commemorative coin program issuance limitation under 13 section 5112(m)(1) of title 31, United States Code (as in effect on the date of the enactment of this Act). The Sec-14 15 retary of the Treasury may issue guidance to carry out this subsection. 16

17 SEC. 8. FINANCIAL ASSURANCES.

18 The Secretary shall take such actions as may be nec-19 essary to ensure that—

20 (1) minting and issuing coins under this Act
21 will not result in any net cost to the United States
22 Government; and

(2) no funds, including applicable surcharges,
shall be disbursed to any recipient designated in section 7 until the total cost of designing and issuing

all of the coins authorized by this Act (including
 labor, materials, dies, use of machinery, overhead ex penses, marketing, and shipping) is recovered by the
 United States Treasury, consistent with sections
 5112(m) and 5134(f) of title 31, United States
 Code.
