## A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to expand and extend Department of Veterans Affairs assistance for homeless veterans, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Affordable Housing  
5 for Homeless Veterans Act of 2021”.

1 **SEC. 2. EXPANSION AND EXTENSION OF DEPARTMENT OF**  
2 **VETERANS AFFAIRS ASSISTANCE FOR HOME-**  
3 **LESS VETERANS.**

4 (a) EXPANSION.—Subsection (a) of section 2041 of  
5 title 38, United States Code, is amended—

6 (1) in paragraph (1)—

7 (A) in the matter preceding subparagraph  
8 (A), by inserting “or permanent housing” after  
9 “shelter”;

10 (B) in subparagraph (A), by striking  
11 “named in, or approved by the Secretary under,  
12 section 5902 of this title” and inserting “that  
13 is the recipient of a grant under section 2011,  
14 2013, 2044, or 2061 of this title”; and

15 (C) in subparagraph (B), by inserting “,  
16 tribal entity,” after “State”; and

17 (2) in paragraph (3)(B)—

18 (A) in clause (i), by inserting “or to sell or  
19 rent the property directly to homeless veterans  
20 or veterans at-risk of homelessness” after “fam-  
21 ilies”; and

22 (B) in each of clauses (i), (ii), and (iii), by  
23 striking the comma and inserting a semicolon.

1           (b) EXTENSION.—Subsection (c) of such section is  
2 amended by striking “September 30, 2017” and inserting  
3 “September 30, 2025”.
