## AN ACT

To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to seek to enter into an agreement with the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine for a review of examinations, furnished by the Secretary, to individuals who submit claims to the Secretary for compensation under chapter 11 of title 38, United States Code, for mental and physical conditions linked to military sexual trauma.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. INDEPENDENT REVIEW OF ASSESSMENTS BY 4 THE SECRETARY OF VETERANS AFFAIRS OF MENTAL AND PHYSICAL CONDITIONS LINKED 6 TO MILITARY SEXUAL TRAUMA FOR PUR-7 **POSES** AWARDING DISABILITY 8 PENSATION. 9 (a) AGREEMENT.—Not later than 90 days after the 10 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall seek to enter into an agreement with the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and 12 Medicine (in this Act referred to as the "National Academies") to perform the services covered by this section. 14 15 (b) Comprehensive Review.—Under an agreement between the Secretary and the National Academies under 16 this section, the National Academies shall conduct a comprehensive review of examinations, furnished by the Sec-18 19 retary to individuals who submit claims to the Secretary 20 for compensation under chapter 11 of title 38, United 21 States Code, for mental and physical conditions linked to military sexual trauma (in this Act referred to as "MST"), 23 for the purpose of assessing the impairments of such individuals arising from MST. The review carried out pursuant to paragraph (1) shall include the following elements:

1	(1) A determination of the adequacy of tools
2	and protocols used by the Secretary to provide ex-
3	aminations described in this subsection, including—
4	(A) the Disability Benefits Questionnaires;
5	(B) the Department's schedule of rating
6	disabilities;
7	(C) consideration of whether certain condi-
8	tions linked to MST should require referral for
9	both a mental health examination and a phys-
10	ical health examination; and
11	(D) the necessity of internal pelvic exami-
12	nations to diagnose certain conditions linked to
13	MST, and whether alternatives to such exami-
14	nations could be considered if a veteran objects
15	to or cannot complete such examination.
16	(2) A determination of what credentials and
17	training are necessary for a health care specialist or
18	provider to perform such examinations related to
19	physical conditions linked to MST, for men and for
20	women, including—
21	(A) sexual dysfunction;
22	(B) pelvic pain;
23	(C) pelvic dysfunction;
24	(D) musculoskeletal disabilities: and

1	(E) cardiovascular conditions (including
2	stroke).
3	(3) A determination of what credentials and
4	training are necessary for a health care specialist or
5	provider to perform such examinations related to
6	mental health conditions linked to MST, for men
7	and for women.
8	(4) An assessment of the quality of MST train-
9	ing for individuals who perform such examinations
10	including recommendations for improvements to
11	such training.
12	(e) Reports.—
13	(1) Report of the national academies.—
14	Not later than 540 days after the date on which the
15	Secretary enters into an agreement under subsection
16	(a), the National Academies shall submit to the
17	Committees on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and
18	House of Representatives a report on the com-
19	prehensive review conducted under subsection (b)
20	Such report shall include the following elements:
21	(A) The findings of the National Acad-
22	emies under subsection (b).
23	(B) Recommendations of the National
24	Academies regarding legislative or administra-

1	tive action to improve of the adjudication of
2	claims described in subsection (b).

(2) Report of the secretary.—Not later than 90 days after submission of the report under paragraph (1), the Secretary shall submit to the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representatives and the Senate a report on the plans of the Secretary to carry out any action based on the findings and recommendations of the National Academies.
