For an additional amount for "Overseas Humanitarian, Disaster, and Civic Aid", \$4,000,000,000, to remain available until September 30, 2023, for support of
Operation Allies Welcome by the Department of Defense.

7 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE

8 SEC. 1101. Not later than 30 days after the date of 9 enactment of this Act, and every 30 days thereafter 10 through fiscal year 2022, the Secretary of Defense shall provide a written report to the congressional defense com-11 12 mittees describing the execution of funds provided in this 13 title, including the amounts obligated and expended, in total and since the previous report; the nature of the costs 14 15 incurred or services provided by such funds; and any reimbursements or funds transferred by another Federal agen-16 17 cy to the Department of Defense which relates to the pur-18 pose of the funds provided by this title.

SEC. 1102. Notwithstanding any other provision of
law, funds provided by this title shall only be for the purposes specified, and shall not be subject to any transfer
authority provided by law.

21	paroled into the United States under section $212(d)(5)$ of

17 For an additional amount for "United States Emer-18 Refugee and Migration Assistance Fund", gency 19 \$1,200,000,000, to remain available until expended, notwith standing section 2(c)(2) of the Migration and Refugee 20 21 Assistance Act of 1962 (22 U.S.C. 2601(c)(2)), for sup-22 port for Operation Allies Welcome and related efforts by 23 the Department of State, including additional relocations 24 of individuals at risk as a result of the situation in Af-25 ghanistan and related expenses.

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GENERAL PROVISION—THIS TITLE

2 SEC. 1401. The Secretary of State shall include in 3 the reports required by section 2402 of title IV of the Af-4 ghanistan Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2022 (divi-5 sion C of Public Law 117–43) the proposed uses of funds 6 appropriated under this title.

- TITLE V
- 8 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS ACT

9 SEC. 1501. Each amount appropriated or made avail10 able by this Act is in addition to amounts otherwise appro11 priated for the fiscal year involved.

12 SEC. 1502. No part of any appropriation contained in this Act shall remain available for obligation beyond 13 the current fiscal year unless expressly so provided herein. 14 15 SEC. 1503. Unless otherwise provided for by this Act, the additional amounts appropriated by this Act to appro-16 17 priations accounts shall be available under the authorities and conditions applicable to such appropriations accounts 18 19 for fiscal year 2022.

SEC. 1504. Each amount provided by this division is
designated by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 4001(a)(1) and section
4001(b) of S. Con. Res. 14 (117th Congress), the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2022.

1 SEC. 1505. Not later than January 15, 2022, the Di-2 rector of the Office of Management and Budget shall pro-3 vide to the Committees on Appropriations of the House 4 of Representatives and the Senate a written report on Op-5 eration Allies Welcome: *Provided*, That such report shall describe the strategy and transition plan leading to the 6 7 conclusion of Operation Allies Welcome; a plan, including 8 timeline, for relocating all Afghans currently residing at 9 Department of Defense facilities to longer-term housing; 10 the activities and responsibilities assigned to each Federal agency involved in such strategy and transition plan; and 11 12 an estimate of the costs from each such agency for car-13 rying out such strategy and transition plan.

14 This division may be cited as the "Additional Afghan-15 istan Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2022".

6 SEC. 2103. EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY ORDER FOR 7 FENTANYL-RELATED SUBSTANCES.

8 Effective as if included in the enactment of the Tem-9 porary Reauthorization and Study of the Emergency 10 Scheduling of Fentanyl Analogues Act (Public Law 116– 11 114), section 2 of such Act (as amended by Public Law 12 117–43) is amended by striking "January 28, 2022" and 13 inserting "February 18, 2022".

14 SEC. 2104. EXTENDING INCREASED FMAP FOR CERTAIN 15 TERRITORIES.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1905(ff)(3) of the Social
Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396d(ff)(3)) is amended by
striking "December 3, 2021" and inserting "February 18,
2022".

20 (b) REDUCTION \mathbf{OF} MEDICARE IMPROVEMENT 21 FUND.—Section 1898(b)(1) of the Social Security Act (42) U.S.C. 22 1395iii(b)(1))is amended by striking "\$69,000,000" and inserting "\$56,000,000". 23
