## A BILL

To provide for the issuance of a semipostal to benefit  
programs that combat invasive species.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Stamp Out Invasive  
5 Species Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. COMBATING INVASIVE SPECIES SEMIPOSTAL.**

2 (a) FINDING.—Congress finds that invasive species  
3 pose a serious threat to our natural ecosystems, signifi-  
4 cantly harm native plant and animal populations, and  
5 cause detrimental economic damage to local communities.

6 (b) SEMIPOSTAL.—In order to afford a convenient  
7 way for members of the public to contribute to programs  
8 at the Department of the Interior and the Department of  
9 Agriculture that combat invasive species, the United  
10 States Postal Service shall issue a semipostal stamp in ac-  
11 cordance with the provisions of this section. Such  
12 semipostal stamp shall be known as the “Combating  
13 Invasive Species Semipostal Stamp”.

14 (c) TERMS AND CONDITIONS.—

15 (1) IN GENERAL.—The issuance and sale of the  
16 Combating Invasive Species Semipostal Stamp shall  
17 be governed by the provisions of section 416 of title  
18 39, United States Code, and regulations issued  
19 under such section, subject to the requirements of  
20 this subsection.

21 (2) DIFFERENTIAL RATE.—The differential in-  
22 cluded in the rate of postage established for the  
23 Combating Invasive Species Semipostal Stamp under  
24 section 416(c) of such title may not exceed 25 per-  
25 cent.

1           (3) DURATION.—The Combating Invasive Spe-  
2           cies Semipostal Stamp shall be made available to the  
3           public for a period of 2 years, beginning not later  
4           than 12 months after the date of enactment of this  
5           Act.

6           (4) DISPOSITION OF PROCEEDS.—All amounts  
7           becoming available from the sale of the Combating  
8           Invasive Species Semipostal Stamp (as determined  
9           under section 416(d) of such title) shall be trans-  
10          ferred in equal proportion to the Department of the  
11          Interior and the Department of Agriculture, for the  
12          programs described in subsection (b), through pay-  
13          ments which shall be made at least twice a year.

14          (d) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this Act, the term  
15          “semipostal stamp” means a stamp described in section  
16          416(a)(1) of such title.
