AN ACT

- To authorize the Director of the National Science Foundation to award grants to support research on the disruption of regular cognitive processes associated with COVID-19 infection, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Brycen Gray and Ben3 Price COVID-19 Cognitive Research Act".

4 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

5 In this Act—

- 6 (1) the term "Director" means the Director of7 the National Science Foundation;
- 8 (2) the term "National Academies" means the
 9 National Academies of Science, Engineering, and
 10 Medicine; and
- (3) the term "eligible entity" means an institution of higher education (as such term is defined in
 section 102 of the Higher Education Act of 1965
 (20 U.S.C. 1002)) or a consortium composed of nonprofit organizations and institutions of higher education.

17 SEC. 3. FINDINGS.

18 Congress makes the following findings:

(1) The COVID-19 pandemic has disrupted
nearly every aspect of life across the globe. Furthermore, it has produced major disruptions of individual's physical and mental health, including with respect of children and adolescents.

24 (2) Historical epidemiological perspectives sug-25 gest an association between exposure to general res-

-	phatony masses and subsequent disruption of reg
2	ular cognitive processes.
3	(3) Early research suggests that one in three
4	individuals diagnosed with a COVID-19 infection
5	experiences a disruption of regular cognitive proc-
6	esses within six months of such diagnosis.
7	(4) Research is urgently needed to better un-
8	derstand why disruption in regular cognitive proc-
9	esses occur in patients as a consequence of a
10	COVID-19 infection and how long such disruptions
11	can continue after recovery.
12	(5) The National Science Foundation has a
13	deep history of supporting interdisciplinary, basic re-
14	search that spans the social, behavioral, and funda-

15 mental biological sciences and paves the way for sci-16 entific advancements.

17 SEC. 4. NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION RESEARCH.

18 The Director shall award grants to eligible entities, 19 including through the RAPID funding mechanism, on a 20 competitive, merit-reviewed basis to support interdiscipli-21 nary research on the disruption of regular cognitive proc-22 esses associated with both short-term and long-term 23 COVID–19 infections, including with respect to children 24 and adolescents. Such research may include the following:

(1) Foundational studies on the effects of cognition, emotion, and neural structure and function relating to any disruption of regular cognitive processes associated with COVID-19 infection.

5 (2) Analysis of findings on the disruption of
6 regular cognitive processes associated with COVID–
7 19 infection, including the development of predictive
8 theoretical frameworks to guide future research.

9 (3) Development of physical and conceptual 10 tools needed to evaluate cognition, emotion, and neu-11 ral structure and function of the brain as a con-12 sequence of a COVID-19 infection, and the potential 13 relevance of such infection to the disruption of reg-14 ular cognitive processes.

(4) Studies on the relevance of psychological
and psychosocial factors, including major disruptions
of physical health, mental health, and economic stability associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, on
the disruption of regular cognitive processes, including an identification and evaluation of such factors.

(5) Any other activities the Director determines
will support interdisciplinary research and collaboration on the disruption of regular cognitive processes
associated with COVID-19 infection, including with
respect to children and adolescents.

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1	D SEC. 5. NATIONAL ACADEMIES STUDY ON THE DISRUPTION
2	OF COGNITIVE PROCESSES ASSOCIATED
3	WITH COVID-19 INFECTION.
4	(a) Study.—
5	(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 45 days after
6	the date of the enactment of this Act, the Director
7	shall enter into an agreement with the National
8	Academies to study and produce a report on the dis-
9	ruption of cognitive processes associated with
10	COVID–19 infection. The study shall—
11	(A) review the research literature and iden-
12	tify research gaps regarding Federal programs
13	and activities with roles in addressing both
14	short-term and long-term consequences associ-
15	ated with COVID–19 infection;
16	(B) assess the necessity of establishing
17	causal inference approaches into research on
18	the impacts of COVID–19 infection on cognitive
19	processes to determine reverse causation;
20	(C) evaluate and make recommendations
21	regarding the coordination of research and data
22	collection, including with respect to children
23	and adolescents, to identify the disruption of
24	regular cognitive processes associated with
25	COVID–19 infection, including long-term
26	COVID–19;

1 (D) evaluate impacts of COVID-19 infec-2 tion on populations under-represented in cog-3 nitive literature, such as poor, rural, and minor-4 ity populations; and 5 (E) make recommendations regarding ways

6 to coordinate engagement with researchers and 7 stakeholders from universities, industry, public 8 health organizations, State and local govern-9 ments, elementary and secondary educational 10 organizations, and non-profit organizations to 11 ensure that research, information, and best 12 practices relating to the disruption of regular 13 cognitive processes associated with COVID-19 14 infection, including long-term COVID-19, are 15 shared among such entities.

16 (2) COMPLETION.—The study required under
17 paragraph (1) shall be completed by not later than
18 the date that is 16 months after the date of the en19 actment of this Act.

20 (b) Reports.—

(1) BY THE NATIONAL ACADEMIES.—Upon
completion of the study under subsection (a), the
National Academies shall transmit to the Director
and Congress a report on such study.

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1 (2) BY THE DIRECTOR.—Not later than three 2 months after receipt of the report under paragraph 3 (1), the Director shall transmit to Congress a sum-4 mary of the Director's plans, if any, to implement 5 the recommendations of the National Academies 6 contained in such report.

7 SEC. 6. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

8 There is authorized to be appropriated to the Direc-9 tor to carry out this Act \$10,000,000 for fiscal year 2023, 10 to remain available through fiscal year 2025, of which 11 \$1,000,000 is authorized to carry out the study and 12 produce the reports under section 5.
