To amend the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, review a final rule of the Federal Emergency Management Agency, and for other purposes.

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

17	who speak a language other than English
18	and speak English less than 'very well';

3	"(C) the impact to community infrastruc-
4	ture, including—
5	"(i) disruptions to community life-sav-
6	ing and life-sustaining services;
7	"(ii) disruptions or increased demand
8	for essential community services; and
9	"(iii) disruptions to transportation, in-
10	frastructure, and utilities; and
11	"(D) any other information relevant to
12	demonstrate severe local impacts.".
13	SEC. 3. GAO REVIEW OF A FINAL RULE.
14	(a) IN GENERAL.—The Comptroller General shall
15	conduct a review of the Federal Emergency Management
16	Agency's implementation of its final rule, published on
17	March 21, 2019, amending section 206.48(b) of title 44,
18	Code of Federal Regulations (regarding factors considered
19	when evaluating a Governor's request for a major disaster
20	declaration), which revised the factors that the Agency
21	considers when evaluating a Governor's request for a
22	major disaster declaration authorizing individual assist-
23	ance under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and
24	Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq).

- 1 (b) Scope.—The review required under subsection 2 (a) shall include the following:
- 3 (1) An assessment of the criteria used by the 4 Agency to assess individual assistance requests fol-5 lowing a major disaster declaration authorizing indi-6 vidual assistance.
  - (2) An assessment of the consistency with which the Agency uses the updated Individual Assistance Declaration Factors when assessing the impact of individual communities after a major disaster declaration.
- 12 (3) An assessment of the impact, if any, of 13 using the updated Individual Assistance Declaration 14 Factors has had on equity in disaster recovery out-15 comes.
- 16 (4) Recommendations to improve the use of the 17 Individual Assistance Declaration Factors to in-18 crease equity in disaster recovery outcomes.
- 19 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date 20 of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General shall 21 submit to the Committee on Transportation and Infra-22 structure of the House of Representatives and the Com-

mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

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- 1 of the Senate a report on the review required under this
- 2 section.
