A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to require the display by the Department of Homeland Security of appropriate signage throughout airports to increase the public’s awareness of the signs of human trafficking, and for other purposes.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Increasing Human
5 Trafficking Awareness Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. AIRPORT SIGNAGE TO INCREASE PUBLIC AWARE-**
2 **NESS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING.**

3 Subparagraph (B) of section 434(e)(6) of the Home-
4 land Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 242(e)(6)) is amend-
5 ed by inserting “, including by displaying appropriate
6 signage, as well as such indicator cards, fact sheets, pam-
7 phlets, posters, and brochures, throughout airports, in-
8 cluding at airport security screening checkpoints, to in-
9 crease the public’s awareness of the signs of human traf-
10 ficking” before the semicolon.
