#### AN ACT

- To amend title 13, United States Code, to improve the operations of the Bureau of the Census, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Ensuring a Fair and
- 3 Accurate Census Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. MODIFICATION OF CERTAIN BUREAU OF THE CEN-
- 5 SUS AUTHORITIES.
- 6 (a) Budget Requests.—
- 7 (1) In General.—Subchapter I of chapter 1 of
- 8 title 13, United States Code, is amended by insert-
- 9 ing after section 13 the following:

#### 10 "§ 14. Budget requests

- 11 "(a) With respect to the budget request of the Bu-
- 12 reau for fiscal year 2027 and each fiscal year thereafter
- 13 submitted to the President for inclusion in the annual
- 14 budget submission under section 1105(a) of title 31, the
- 15 Director shall include in such request to the Secretary the
- 16 estimated costs of carrying out the duties of the Bureau
- 17 during the five-year period beginning on the fiscal year
- 18 covered by such request.
- 19 "(b) On the date that the estimate of costs is sub-
- 20 mitted to the Secretary under subsection (a), the Director
- 21 shall submit such estimate to the Committee on Oversight
- 22 and Reform of the House of Representatives, the Com-
- 23 mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs
- 24 of the Senate, the Committees on the Budget of the House
- 25 of Representatives and the Senate, and the Committees

1	on Appropriations of the House of Representatives and the
2	Senate.".
3	(2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sec-

7	(b) Duties.—Section 21(c) of title 13, United States
8	Code, is amended to read as follows:
9	"(c) Duties.—
10	"(1) In general.—The Director shall perform
11	such duties as may be imposed upon the Director by
12	law, regulations, or orders of the Secretary. The Di-
13	rector shall report directly to the Deputy Secretary
14	of Commerce.
15	"(2) Decennial census.—Any operational,
16	statistical, or technical decision for any decennial
17	census of population may be made only by the Direc-
18	tor.".
19	(c) Advisory Committees; Deputy Director.—
20	(1) In General.—Section 21 of title 13,
21	United States Code, as amended by subsection (b),
22	is further amended—
23	(A) in the section heading, by striking
24	"duties" and inserting "Deputy Director;
25	advisory committees"; and

1	(B) by adding at the end the following:
2	"(d) Deputy Director.—

- "(1) IN GENERAL.—There shall be in the Bureau a single Deputy Director of the Bureau, to be appointed by the Director. The position of Deputy Director shall be a career reserved position (as that term is defined in section 3132(a)(8) of title 5). The Deputy Director shall be selected from among any career appointee (as that term is defined in section 3132(a)(4) of such title) at any agency. The individual appointed to the position of Deputy Director shall be made from individuals who have a demonstrated ability in managing large organizations and experience in the collection, analysis, and use of statistical data.
- "(2) Functions.—The Deputy Director shall perform such functions as the Director shall designate. During any absence or disability of the Director, the Deputy Director shall act as Director.
- "(3) Vacancy.—In the event of a vacancy in the office of Director, or when the Director is absent or unable to serve, the Deputy Director shall act as Director until a Director is appointed. If no individual is serving as Deputy Director, the highest level career employee of the Bureau shall act as Di-

1	rector until a Deputy Director or Director is ap-
2	pointed. This paragraph shall serve as the exclusive
3	means of designating an acting Director.
4	"(4) Census equity official.—The Deputy
5	Director shall appoint an employee within the Bu-
6	reau, who shall report directly to the Deputy Direc-
7	tor, and who shall be responsible for optimizing ra-
8	cial and ethnic equity in the decennial census of pop-
9	ulation, including by—
10	"(A) enhancing outreach to, and collabo-
11	rating with, organizations and stakeholders that
12	have demonstrated their influence with racial
13	and ethnic communities that historically have
14	had census participation rates that are lower
15	than those of the overall population;
16	"(B) maximizing participation among ra-
17	cial and ethnic demographic cohorts that have
18	historically had census participation rates that
19	are lower than those of the overall population;
20	"(C) rectifying the undercount of cohorts
21	of the population that have been undercounted
22	in recent decennial census counts; and
23	"(D) any other strategies, initiatives, ac-
24	tivities, or operations that would optimize such
25	equity.

#### "(e) Advisory Committees.—

"(1) General Authority.—In accordance with the Federal Advisory Committee Act (5 U.S.C. App.), and subject to paragraph (2), the Director may establish advisory committees to provide advice with respect to the mission of the Bureau. Members of any such committee, including a committee established under paragraph (2), shall serve without compensation, but shall be entitled to transportation expenses and per diem in lieu of subsistence in accordance with section 5703 of title 5.

#### "(2) Specific advisory committees.—

"(A) BUREAU OF THE CENSUS ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON STATISTICAL QUALITY STAND-ARDS.—The Director shall appoint a committee, to be known as the 'Advisory Committee on Statistical Quality Standards', composed of five members to review and provide recommendations on the statistical quality standards of the Bureau that guide the production and release of all Bureau decennial census products.

"(B) NATIONAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

AND SCIENTIFIC ADVISORY COMMITTEE.—There
are hereby established the Bureau of the Census Scientific Advisory Committee and the Cen-

l	sus Bureau National Advisory Committee on
2	Racial, Ethnic, and Other Populations, as de-
3	scribed in the charters for each such committee
4	published on March 15, 2022, and March 23,
5	2022, respectively, or any subsequent charters.
5	Such advisory committees shall operate under
7	the terms and conditions set forth in the appli-
8	cable charter.

- "(C) 2030 CENSUS ADVISORY COM-MITTEE.—The Director shall appoint an advisory committee, substantially similar to the 2010 Census Advisory Committee, consisting of up to 20 member organizations to address policy, research, and technical issues related to the design and implementation of the 2030 decennial census and the American Community Survey.".

5	other positions.".

15	"(1) Notice to congress of subjects,
16	TYPES OF INFORMATION, AND QUESTIONS.—In the
17	2030 decennial census of population and each decen-
18	nial census thereafter, the Secretary may not include
19	any subject, type of information, or question that
20	was not submitted to Congress in accordance with
21	subsection (f).
22	"(2) Biannual reports.—
23	"(A) Submission to congress.—Not
24	later than April 1 of the calendar year begin-
25	ning after the date of enactment of the Ensur-

1	ing a Fair and Accurate Census Act and bian-
2	nually thereafter, the Secretary shall submit to
3	Congress a report that—
4	"(i) describes each component of the
5	operational plan for the subsequent decen-
6	nial census of population; and
7	"(ii) includes a detailed statement on
8	the status of all research, testing, and op-
9	erations that are part of the Bureau's com-
10	prehensive plan for the decennial census,
11	and including a detailed statement on the
12	status of any initiatives, developments, and
13	operations within the purview of the offi-
14	cial appointed by the Deputy Director
15	under section $21(d)(4)$ .
16	"(B) Internet publication.—On the
17	date on which the Secretary submits a report
18	under subparagraph (A), the Secretary shall
19	publish the report on the public internet website
20	of the Bureau.
21	"(3) Secretary certification.—
22	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, upon
23	the date of submission of the report required by
24	subsection (f)(2), shall submit, to the commit-
25	tees of Congress having legislative jurisdiction

over the census, a certification stating that any question that has not appeared on the previous two decennial censuses has been researched, studied, and tested according to established statistical policies and procedures.

- "(B) GAO REVIEW.—Not later than 6 months after the Secretary submits a certification under paragraph (2), the Comptroller General of the United States shall review such certification and submit a report to Congress on whether the questions to be included in the census have been researched, studied, and tested according to established statistical policies and procedures."; and
- 15 (3) in subsection (i), as so redesignated, by in-16 serting "Definition.—" before "As used in".

#### 17 SEC. 4. DECENNIAL CENSUS LIFECYCLE COST ESTIMATES.

- Section 141 of title 13, United States Code, as 19 amended by section 3, is further amended by inserting 20 after subsection (g) the following:
- 21 "(h) Lifecycle Costs.—
- "(1) ESTIMATE.—Not later than January 1, 23 2026, and every ten years thereafter, the Director 24 shall transmit to the chairs of the committees de-25 scribed in paragraph (3) a lifecycle cost estimate for

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1	the decennial census of population first occurring
2	after the date of such transmittal. Such estimate
3	shall include the following with respect to such
4	lifecycle:
5	"(A) An estimate of costs by each fiscal
6	year.
7	"(B) Estimates of capital versus operating
8	expenses.
9	"(C) Staffing projections for each year.
10	"(D) Assumptions about response rates,
11	wages, and other economic variables.
12	"(2) UPDATE.—On the date the President sub-
13	mits the annual budget under section 1105(a) of
14	title 31 during any calendar year a decennial of cen-
15	sus of population is taken under this section, and on
16	the date such annual budget is submitted during the
17	immediately preceding four calendar years, the Di-
18	rector shall transmit a report describing any changes
19	to the applicable lifecycle estimate transmitted under
20	paragraph (1). Such report shall include the fol-
21	lowing:
22	"(A) The basis for any such changes.
23	"(B) Projected impacts on response rates,
24	staffing requirements, or costs throughout the
25	lifecycle.

1	"(C) An explanation of any differences in
2	budgetary resources between the amount re-
3	quested in the President's annual budget re-
4	quest and the lifecycle cost estimate, as updated
5	by this paragraph.
6	"(3) Committees.—The committees described
7	in this paragraph are the Committee on Oversight
8	and Reform of the House of Representatives, the
9	Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental
10	Affairs of the Senate, and the Committees on Appro-
11	priations of the House of Representatives and the
12	Senate.".
