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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3617) to decriminalize and deschedule cannabis, to provide for reinvestment in certain persons adversely impacted by the War on Drugs, to provide for expungement of certain cannabis offenses, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 6833) to amend title XXVII of the Public Health Service Act, the Internal

Revenue Code of 1986, and the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 to establish requirements with respect to cost-sharing for certain insulin products, and for other purposes; and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it  
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.  
3 3617) to decriminalize and deschedule cannabis, to pro-  
4 vide for reinvestment in certain persons adversely im-  
5 pacted by the War on Drugs, to provide for expungement  
6 of certain cannabis offenses, and for other purposes. All  
7 points of order against consideration of the bill are waived.  
8 In lieu of the amendment in the nature of a substitute  
9 recommended by the Committee on the Judiciary now  
10 printed in the bill, an amendment in the nature of a sub-  
11 stitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print  
12 117–37, modified by the amendment printed in part A of  
13 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this  
14 resolution, shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as  
15 amended, shall be considered as read. All points of order  
16 against provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The  
17 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the  
18 bill, as amended, and on any further amendment thereto,  
19 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one  
20 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair  
21 and ranking minority member of the Committee on the  
22 Judiciary or their respective designees; (2) the further

1 amendments described in section 2 of this resolution; and  
2 (3) one motion to recommit.

3       SEC. 2. After debate pursuant to the first section of  
4 this resolution, each further amendment printed in part  
5 B of the report of the Committee on Rules shall be consid-  
6 ered only in the order printed in the report, may be offered  
7 only by a Member designated in the report, shall be con-  
8 sidered as read, shall be debatable for the time specified  
9 in the report equally divided and controlled by the pro-  
10 ponent and an opponent, may be withdrawn by the pro-  
11 ponent at any time before the question is put thereon,  
12 shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be sub-  
13 ject to a demand for division of the question. All points  
14 of order against the further amendments printed in part  
15 B of the report of the Committee on Rules are waived.

16       SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
17 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 6833)  
18 to amend title XXVII of the Public Health Service Act,  
19 the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and the Employee Re-  
20 tirement Income Security Act of 1974 to establish require-  
21 ments with respect to cost-sharing for certain insulin  
22 products, and for other purposes. All points of order  
23 against consideration of the bill are waived. An amend-  
24 ment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the text  
25 of Rules Committee Print 117–38, modified by the amend-

1 ment printed in part C of the report of the Committee  
2 on Rules accompanying this resolution, shall be considered  
3 as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as  
4 read. All points of order against provisions in the bill, as  
5 amended, are waived. The previous question shall be con-  
6 sidered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any  
7 further amendment thereto, to final passage without inter-  
8 vening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally di-  
9 vided among and controlled by the respective chairs and  
10 ranking minority members of the Committees on Edu-  
11 cation and Labor, Energy and Commerce, and Ways and  
12 Means, or their respective designees; and (2) one motion  
13 to recommit.

14       SEC. 4. House Resolution 188, agreed to March 8,  
15 2021 (as most recently amended by House Resolution  
16 900, agreed to February 2, 2022), is amended by striking  
17 “April 1, 2022” each place it appears and inserting (in  
18 each instance) “April 29, 2022”.



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
