Mr. NEGUSE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3771) to amend the Public Health Service Act to provide for research and improvement of cardiovascular health among the South Asian population of the United States, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5118) to direct the Secretary of Agriculture to prioritize the completion of the Continental Divide National Scenic Trail, and for other purposes; providing

for consideration of the bill (H.R. 6929) to increase the benefits guaranteed in connection with certain pension plans, and for other purposes; and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 3771) to amend the Public Health Service Act to provide
4 for research and improvement of cardiovascular health
5 among the South Asian population of the United States,
6 and for other purposes. All points of order against consid-
7 eration of the bill are waived. In lieu of the amendment
8 in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Com-
9 mittee on Energy and Commerce now printed in the bill,
10 an amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of
11 the text of Rules Committee Print 117–58 shall be consid-
12 ered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered
13 as read. All points of order against provisions in the bill,
14 as amended, are waived. The previous question shall be
15 considered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any
16 further amendment thereto, to final passage without inter-
17 vening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally di-
18 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority
19 member of the Committee on Energy and Commerce or
20 their respective designees; (2) the further amendment
21 printed in part A of the report of the Committee on Rules
22 accompanying this resolution, if offered by the Member

1 designated in the report, which shall be in order without
2 intervention of any point of order, shall be considered as
3 read, shall be separately debatable for the time specified
4 in the report equally divided and controlled by the pro-
5 ponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject to a
6 demand for division of the question; and (3) one motion
7 to recommit.

8 SEC. 2. At any time after adoption of this resolution
9 the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule XVIII,
10 declare the House resolved into the Committee of the
11 Whole House on the state of the Union for consideration
12 of the bill (H.R. 5118) to direct the Secretary of Agri-
13 culture to prioritize the completion of the Continental Di-
14 vide National Scenic Trail, and for other purposes. The
15 first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points
16 of order against consideration of the bill are waived. Gen-
17 eral debate shall be confined to the bill and amendments
18 specified in this section and shall not exceed one hour
19 equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking
20 minority member of the Committee on Natural Resources
21 or their respective designees. After general debate the bill
22 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute
23 rule. In lieu of the amendment in the nature of a sub-
24 stitute recommended by the Committee on Natural Re-
25 sources now printed in the bill, an amendment in the na-

1 ture of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Com-
2 mittee Print 117-57, modified by the amendment printed
3 in part B of the report of the Committee on Rules accom-
4 panying this resolution, shall be considered as adopted in
5 the House and in the Committee of the Whole. The bill,
6 as amended, shall be considered as the original bill for
7 the purpose of further amendment under the five-minute
8 rule and shall be considered as read. All points of order
9 against provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. No
10 further amendment to the bill, as amended, shall be in
11 order except those printed in part C of the report of the
12 Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution. Each
13 such further amendment may be offered only in the order
14 printed in the report, may be offered only by a Member
15 designated in the report, shall be considered as read, shall
16 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally
17 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,
18 shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be sub-
19 ject to a demand for division of the question in the House
20 or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order
21 against such further amendments are waived. At the con-
22 clusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the
23 Committee shall rise and report the bill, as amended, to
24 the House with such further amendments as may have
25 been adopted. In the case of sundry further amendments

1 reported from the Committee, the question of their adop-
2 tion shall be put to the House en gros and without division
3 of the question. The previous question shall be considered
4 as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final
5 passage without intervening motion except one motion to
6 recommit.

7 SEC. 3. During consideration of H.R. 5118, the Chair
8 may entertain a motion that the Committee rise only if
9 offered by the chair of the Committee on Natural Re-
10 sources or his designee. The Chair may not entertain a
11 motion to strike out the enacting words of the bill (as de-
12 scribed in clause 9 of rule XVIII).

13 SEC. 4. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
14 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 6929)
15 to increase the benefits guaranteed in connection with cer-
16 tain pension plans, and for other purposes. All points of
17 order against consideration of the bill are waived. The
18 amendment printed in part D of the report of the Com-
19 mittee on Rules accompanying this resolution shall be con-
20 sidered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be consid-
21 ered as read. All points of order against provisions in the
22 bill, as amended, are waived. The previous question shall
23 be considered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on
24 any further amendment thereto, to final passage without
25 intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally

1 divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority
2 member of the Committee on Ways and Means or their
3 respective designees; (2) the further amendment printed
4 in part E of the report of the Committee on Rules accom-
5 panying this resolution, if offered by the Member des-
6 ignated in the report, which shall be in order without
7 intervention of any point of order, shall be considered as
8 read, shall be separately debatable for the time specified
9 in the report equally divided and controlled by the pro-
10 ponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject to a
11 demand for division of the question; and (3) one motion
12 to recommit.

13 SEC. 5. (a) At any time through the legislative day
14 of Friday, July 29, 2022, the Speaker may entertain mo-
15 tions offered by the Majority Leader or a designee that
16 the House suspend the rules as though under clause 1 of
17 rule XV with respect to multiple measures described in
18 subsection (b), and the Chair shall put the question on
19 any such motion without debate or intervening motion.

20 (b) A measure referred to in subsection (a) includes
21 any measure that was the object of a motion to suspend
22 the rules on the legislative day of July 26, 2022, July 27,
23 2022, July 28, 2022, or July 29, 2022, in the form as
24 so offered, on which the yeas and nays were ordered and

1 further proceedings postponed pursuant to clause 8 of rule
2 XX.

3 (c) Upon the offering of a motion pursuant to sub-
4 section (a) concerning multiple measures, the ordering of
5 the yeas and nays on postponed motions to suspend the
6 rules with respect to such measures is vacated to the end
7 that all such motions are considered as withdrawn.

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
