RESOLUTION

Of inquiry requesting the President to provide certain documents to the House of Representatives relating to communications and directives with the Federal Trade Commission.

1 *Resolved*, That the President of the United States is
2 requested to furnish the House of Representatives, not
3 later than 14 days after the date of adoption of this reso-
4 lution, copies of any document, record, audio recording,

1 memorandum, call log, correspondence (electronic or oth-
2 erwise), or other communication in his possession, or any
3 portion of any document, record, audio recording, memo-
4 randum, call log, correspondence (electronic or otherwise),
5 or other communication, that refers or relates to the fol-
6 lowing:

7 (1) The decision of the Federal Trade Commis-
8 sion (FTC) to delete “without unduly burdening le-
9 gitimate business activity” from the FTC’s draft
10 strategy plan for fiscal years 2022 to 2026, as such
11 language has been included in FTC mission state-
12 ments for decades, through both Republican and
13 Democrat administrations.

14 (2) The FTC’s goals changing from its tradi-
15 tional focus on protecting consumers from fraud, as
16 well as ensuring businesses have clear rules to fol-
17 low, in favor of an unorthodox interpretation of its
18 antitrust mission to reshape the United States econ-
19 omy.

20 (3) The FTC’s communications and actions
21 with departing commissioners, including casting so-
22 called “zombie” votes after such individual’s depar-
23 ture, and any use of official resources by such indi-
24 vidual during or after such individual’s departure.

1 (4) Complaints received from career FTC em-
2 ployees regarding being silenced with a “gag rule”
3 as well as being terminated for exercising independ-
4 ence from the FTC Chair’s executive staff.

5 (5) Communication or coordination between the
6 Executive Office of the President and the Federal
7 Trade Commission to initiate a Trade Regulation
8 Rule on Commercial Surveillance.

9 (6) Statement by National Economic Council
10 (NEC special assistant Tim Wu) who reportedly
11 “asked the FTC to see if [you] can craft a rule
12 around data collection”.

13 (7) Transmission from the Federal Trade Com-
14 mission to Office of Information and Regulatory Af-
15 fairs on a Trade Regulation Rule on Commercial
16 Surveillance.
