8 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 5768)
9 to direct the Attorney General to establish a grant pro-

12 for other purposes. All points of order against consider-
13 ation of the bill are waived. In lieu of the amendment in
14 the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee
15 on the Judiciary now printed in the bill, an amendment
16 in the nature of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules
17 Committee Print 117-62, modified by the amendment
18 printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accom-
19 panying this resolution, shall be considered as adopted.
20 The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All
21 points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended,
22 are waived. The previous question shall be considered as
23 ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further
24 amendment thereto, to final passage without intervening
25 motion except: (1) 30 minutes of debate equally divided

2 of the Committee on the Judiciary or their respective des-
3 ignees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

4 SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
5 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 6448)
6 to direct the Director of the Office of Community Oriented
7 Policing Services of the Department of Justice to carry
8 out a grant program to provide assistance to police depart-
9 ments with fewer than 200 law enforcement officers, and
10 for other purposes. All points of order against consider-
11 ation of the bill are waived. An amendment in the nature
12 of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee
13 Print 117-65 shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as
14 amended, shall be considered as read. All points of order
15 against provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The
16 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the
17 bill, as amended, and on any further amendment thereto,
18 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) 30
19 minutes of debate equally divided and controlled by the
20 chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on
21 the Judiciary or their respective designees; and (2) one
22 motion to recommit.

23 SEC. 4. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
24 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 8542)
25 to amend the Public Health Service Act to authorize

1 grants to States, Indian Tribes, Tribal organizations,
2 Urban Indian organizations, and political subdivisions
3 thereof to hire, employ, train, and dispatch mental health
4 professionals to respond in lieu of law enforcement officers
5 in emergencies involving one or more persons with a men-
6 tal illness or an intellectual or developmental disability,
7 and for other purposes. All points of order against consid-
8 eration of the bill are waived. The bill shall be considered
9 as read. All points of order against provisions in the bill
10 are waived. The previous question shall be considered as
11 ordered on the bill and on any amendment thereto to final
12 passage without intervening motion except: (1) 30 minutes
13 of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and
14 ranking minority member of the Committee on Energy
15 and Commerce or their respective designees; and (2) one
16 motion to recommit.

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
