Mr. MORELLE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1) to expand Americans' access to the ballot box, reduce the influence of big money in politics, strengthen ethics rules for public servants, and implement other anti-corruption measures for the purpose of fortifying our democracy, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1280) to hold law enforcement accountable for misconduct in court, improve transparency through data

collection, and reform police training and policies; and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 1) to expand Americans' access to the ballot box, reduce
4 the influence of big money in politics, strengthen ethics
5 rules for public servants, and implement other anti-corrup-
6 tion measures for the purpose of fortifying our democracy,
7 and for other purposes. All points of order against consid-
8 eration of the bill are waived. The amendment printed in
9 part A of the report of the Committee on Rules accom-
10 panying this resolution shall be considered as adopted.
11 The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All
12 points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended,
13 are waived. The previous question shall be considered as
14 ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further
15 amendment thereto, to final passage without intervening
16 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and
17 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of
18 the Committee on House Administration or their respec-
19 tive designees; (2) the further amendments described in
20 section 2 of this resolution; (3) the amendments en bloc
21 described in section 3 of this resolution; and (4) one mo-
22 tion to recommit.

23 SEC. 2. After debate pursuant to the first section of
24 this resolution, each further amendment printed in part

1 B of the report of the Committee on Rules not earlier con-
2 sidered as part of amendments en bloc pursuant to section
3 3 of this resolution shall be considered only in the order
4 printed in the report, may be offered only by a Member
5 designated in the report, shall be considered as read, shall
6 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally
7 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,
8 may be withdrawn by the proponent at any time before
9 the question is put thereon, shall not be subject to amend-
10 ment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division
11 of the question.

12 SEC. 3. It shall be in order at any time after debate
13 pursuant to the first section of this resolution for the chair
14 of the Committee on House Administration or her des-
15 ignee to offer amendments en bloc consisting of further
16 amendments printed in part B of the report of the Com-
17 mittee on Rules accompanying this resolution not earlier
18 disposed of. Amendments en bloc offered pursuant to this
19 section shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for
20 20 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair and
21 ranking minority member of the Committee on House Ad-
22 ministration or their respective designees, shall not be sub-
23 ject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand
24 for division of the question.

1 SEC. 4. All points of order against the further amend-
2 ments printed in part B of the report of the Committee
3 on Rules or amendments en bloc described in section 3
4 of this resolution are waived.

5 SEC. 5. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
6 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 1280)
7 to hold law enforcement accountable for misconduct in
8 court, improve transparency through data collection, and
9 reform police training and policies. All points of order
10 against consideration of the bill are waived. The bill shall
11 be considered as read. All points of order against provi-
12 sions in the bill are waived. The previous question shall
13 be considered as ordered on the bill and on any amend-
14 ment thereto to final passage without intervening motion
15 except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and con-
16 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the
17 Committee on the Judiciary or their respective designees;
18 and (2) one motion to recommit.
