Mr. RASKIN, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 51) to provide for the admission of the State of Washington, D.C. into the Union; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1573) to clarify the rights of all persons who are held or detained at a port of entry or at any detention facility overseen by U.S. Customs and Border Protection or U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1333) to transfer and

limit Executive Branch authority to suspend or restrict the entry of a class of aliens; and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 51) to provide for the admission of the State of Wash-
4 ington, D.C. into the Union. All points of order against
5 consideration of the bill are waived. The amendment in
6 the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee
7 on Oversight and Reform now printed in the bill shall be
8 considered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be con-
9 sidered as read. All points of order against provisions in
10 the bill, as amended, are waived. The previous question
11 shall be considered as ordered on the bill, as amended,
12 and on any further amendment thereto, to final passage
13 without intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate
14 equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking
15 minority member of the Committee on Oversight and Re-
16 form or their respective designees; and (2) one motion to
17 recommit.

18 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
19 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 1573)
20 to clarify the rights of all persons who are held or detained
21 at a port of entry or at any detention facility overseen
22 by U.S. Customs and Border Protection or U.S. Immigra-
23 tion and Customs Enforcement. All points of order against
24 consideration of the bill are waived. The amendment in

1 the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee
2 on the Judiciary now printed in the bill shall be considered
3 as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as
4 read. All points of order against provisions in the bill, as
5 amended, are waived. The previous question shall be con-
6 sidered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any
7 further amendment thereto, to final passage without inter-
8 vening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally di-
9 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority
10 member of the Committee on the Judiciary or their respec-
11 tive designees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

12 SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
13 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 1333)
14 to transfer and limit Executive Branch authority to sus-
15 pend or restrict the entry of a class of aliens. All points
16 of order against consideration of the bill are waived. The
17 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by
18 the Committee on the Judiciary now printed in the bill
19 shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall
20 be considered as read. All points of order against provi-
21 sions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The previous
22 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill, as
23 amended, and on any further amendment thereto, to final
24 passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour
25 of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and

1 ranking minority member of the Committee on the Judiciary or their respective designees; and (2) one motion to
2 recommit.

3 SEC. 4. House Resolution 316 is hereby adopted.

4 SEC. 5. House Resolution 188, agreed to March 8,
5 2021, is amended—

6 (1) in section 11, by striking “April 22, 2021”
7 and inserting “May 20, 2021”;

8 (2) in section 16, by striking “calendar day of
9 April 22, 2021” and inserting “legislative day of
10 May 20, 2021”; and

11 (3) in section 17, by striking “April 22, 2021”
12 and inserting “May 20, 2021”.

13 SEC. 6. (a) At any time through the legislative day
14 of Thursday, April 22, 2021, the Speaker may entertain
15 motions offered by the Majority Leader or a designee that
16 the House suspend the rules as though under clause 1 of
17 rule XV with respect to multiple measures described in
18 subsection (b), and the Chair shall put the question on
19 any such motion without debate or intervening motion.

20 (b) A measure referred to in subsection (a) includes
21 any measure that was the object of a motion to suspend
22 the rules on the legislative day of April 19, 2021, or April
23 20, 2021, on which the yeas and nays were ordered and

1 further proceedings postponed pursuant to clause 8 of rule
2 XX.

3 (c) Upon the offering of a motion pursuant to sub-
4 section (a) concerning multiple measures, the ordering of
5 the yeas and nays on postponed motions to suspend the
6 rules with respect to such measures is vacated to the end
7 that all such motions are considered as withdrawn.

8 SEC. 7. (a) House Concurrent Resolution 30 is here-
9 by adopted.

10 (b) For purposes of the joint session to receive the
11 President of the United States on April 28, 2021, former
12 Members, Delegates, and Resident Commissioners shall
13 not be admitted to the Hall of the House or rooms leading
14 thereto.

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
