Mr. BLUMENTHAL (for himself and Ms. ERNST) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To provide for the issuance of a “Gold Star Families Forever Stamp” to honor the sacrifices of families who have lost a loved one who was a member of the Armed Forces in combat.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. GOLD STAR FAMILIES FOREVER STAMP.**

4 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

5 (1) Gold Star families are true national heroes,
6 who deserve our deepest gratitude and respect; and

7 (2) the extraordinary contribution of Gold Star
8 families is beyond measure, not merely for their loss,

1 but also for the comfort they selflessly provide oth-
2 ers and their model of service and sacrifice.

3 (b) ISSUANCE OF FOREVER STAMP.—In order to con-
4 tinue to honor the sacrifices of families who have lost a
5 loved one who was a member of the Armed Forces in com-
6 bat, the Postmaster General shall provide for the issuance
7 of a forever stamp suitable for that purpose.

8 (c) FOREVER STAMP DEFINED.—In this section, the
9 term “forever stamp” means a definitive stamp that—

10 (1) meets the postage required for first-class
11 mail up to 1 ounce in weight; and

12 (2) retains full validity for the purpose de-
13 scribed in paragraph (1) even if the rate of that
14 postage is later increased.

15 (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The stamp described in sub-
16 section (b) shall be issued beginning as soon as practicable
17 after the date of enactment of this Act and shall not there-
18 after be discontinued.
