A BILL

To require the Federal Communications Commission to incorporate data on maternal health outcomes into its broadband health maps.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Data Mapping to Save
5 Moms’ Lives Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. MAPPING BROADBAND CONNECTIVITY AND MATER-**
7 **NAL HEALTH OUTCOMES.**

8 (a) INCORPORATION OF MATERNAL HEALTH OUT-
9 COME DATA.—The Federal Communications Commission

1 shall incorporate data on maternal health outcomes for not
2 less than 1 year postpartum, as recommended by the Cen-
3 ters for Disease Control and Prevention under subsection
4 (b), into the most recently available broadband health
5 mapping tools of the Commission.

6 (b) CONSULTATION WITH CDC.—The Federal Com-
7 munications Commission shall consult with the Centers for
8 Disease Control and Prevention regarding the maternal
9 health outcomes that should be incorporated into the most
10 recently available broadband health mapping tools of the
11 Commission under subsection (a).

12 **SEC. 3. GAO STUDY.**

13 Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment
14 of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United States
15 shall study and submit to Congress a report on—

16 (1) the effectiveness of internet connectivity in
17 reducing maternal morbidity rates; and

18 (2) who is best suited to take responsibility for
19 ensuring better internet connectivity to reduce ma-
20 ternal morbidity rates.

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
