AN ACT

To award posthumously the Congressional Gold Medal to Emmett Till and Mamie Till-Mobley.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Emmett Till and
- 3 Mamie Till-Mobley Congressional Gold Medal Act of
- 4 2021".

5 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

- 6 Congress finds the following:
- 7 (1) The brutal lynching of Emmett Till and the
- 8 subsequent bravery and boldness of his mother,
- 9 Mamie Till-Mobley, became a catalyst for the civil
- rights movement.
- 11 (2) On August 28, 1955, 14-year-old Emmett
- Till was kidnapped, beaten, and shot in Money, Mis-
- sissippi, where he had traveled from Chicago to stay
- with his great uncle, Moses Wright.
- 15 (3) The corpse of Emmett Till was discovered
- 3 days later in the Tallahatchie River and his mur-
- derers were acquitted despite Moses Wright pro-
- viding an eyewitness testimony that the men on trial
- 19 kidnapped Emmett Till.
- 20 (4) Mamie Till-Mobley, the mother of Emmett
- Till, demonstrated her love for her son and her cour-
- age and strength in suffering in the days that fol-
- lowed as she brought the body of Emmett Till back
- to Chicago for burial and demanded an open casket
- 25 funeral, which drew more than 50,000 attendees.

- 1 (5) Mamie Till-Mobley further allowed a photo-2 graph to be taken of Emmett Till in his casket, 3 which was shown throughout the world.
 - (6) The original casket of Emmett Till stands on display at the National Museum of African American History and Culture as an enduring reminder of the racial violence that is a part of the history of the United States that the people of the United States must confront.
 - (7) The heroic actions of Mamie Till-Mobley in the midst of evil, injustice, and grief became a catalyst for the civil rights movement and continued in the years to come as she worked for justice and honored the legacy of Emmett Till.
 - (8) Mamie Till-Mobley went on to create the Emmett Till Players, which was a significant national cultural contribution as teenagers traveled throughout the country presenting Martin Luther King Jr. speeches in the name of Emmett Till.
 - (9) Mamie Till-Mobley also served as chair and co-founder of the Emmett Till Justice Campaign, which had the dual mission of reopening the murder of Emmett Till for a reinvestigation and a passage into law of Federal legislation to ensure that other

- racially motivated murders during the civil rights era
 were investigated and, when possible, prosecuted.
- 3 (10) The efforts of the Emmett Till Justice 4 Campaign led to the successful joint investigation by 5 the State of Mississippi, the Federal Bureau of In-
- 6 vestigation, and the Department of Justice in 2004,
- 7 the passage of the Emmett Till Unsolved Civil
- 8 Rights Crime Act of 2007 (Public Law 110–344;
- 9 122 Stat. 3934), signed into law by President
- 10 George W. Bush, and the Emmett Till Unsolved
- 11 Civil Rights Crimes Reauthorization Act of 2016
- 12 (Public Law 114–325; 130 Stat. 1965), signed into
- law by President Barack Obama.
- 14 (11) The people of the United States honor the
- 15 legacy of Emmett Till and the incredible suffering
- and equally incredible courage, resilience, and efforts
- of Mamie Till-Mobley that led to the civil rights
- movement that began in the 1950s.

19 SEC. 3. CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL.

- 20 (a) Presentation Authorized.—The Speaker of
- 21 the House of Representatives and the President pro tem-
- 22 pore of the Senate shall make appropriate arrangements
- 23 for the posthumous presentation, on behalf of Congress,
- 24 of a gold medal of appropriate design in commemoration
- 25 of Emmett Till and Mamie Till-Mobley.

- 1 (b) Design and Striking.—For purposes of the
- 2 presentation referred to in subsection (a), the Secretary
- 3 of the Treasury (referred to in this Act as the "Sec-
- 4 retary") shall strike a gold medal with suitable emblems,
- 5 devices, and inscriptions, to be determined by the Sec-
- 6 retary. The design shall bear an image of, and inscriptions
- 7 of the name of, "Emmett Till" and "Mamie Till-Mobley".
- 8 (c) AWARD OF MEDAL.—
- 9 (1) IN GENERAL.—After the award of the gold
- medal referred to in subsection (a), the gold medal
- shall be given to the National Museum of African
- 12 American History and Culture, where it shall be dis-
- played as appropriate.
- 14 (2) Sense of congress.—It is the sense of
- 15 Congress that the National Museum of African
- 16 American History and Culture should make the gold
- medal received under paragraph (1) available for
- display elsewhere, particularly at other locations and
- events associated with Emmett Till and Mamie Till-
- Mobley.
- 21 SEC. 4. DUPLICATE MEDALS.
- The Secretary may strike and sell duplicates in
- 23 bronze of the gold medal struck under section 3, at a price
- 24 sufficient to cover the costs of the medals, including labor,
- 25 materials, dies, use of machinery, and overhead expenses.

SEC. 5. STATUS OF MEDALS.

- 2 (a) National Medals.—Medals struck under this
- 3 Act are national medals for purposes of chapter 51 of title
- 4 31, United States Code.
- 5 (b) Numismatic Items.—For purposes of section
- 6 5134 of title 31, United States Code, all medals struck
- 7 under this Act shall be considered to be numismatic items.
- 8 SEC. 6. AUTHORITY TO USE FUND AMOUNTS; PROCEEDS OF
- 9 SALE.
- 10 (a) AUTHORITY TO USE FUND AMOUNTS.—There is
- 11 authorized to be charged against the United States Mint
- 12 Public Enterprise Fund such amounts as may be nec-
- 13 essary to pay for the costs of the medals struck under
- 14 this Act.
- 15 (b) Proceeds of Sales.—Amounts received from
- 16 the sale of duplicate bronze medals authorized under sec-
- 17 tion 4 shall be deposited into the United States Mint Pub-
- 18 lie Enterprise Fund.
