1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Ensuring a Fair and3 Accurate Census Act".

4 SEC. 2. MODIFICATION OF CERTAIN BUREAU OF THE CEN5 SUS AUTHORITIES.
6 (a) BUDGET REQUESTS.—
7 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter I of chapter 1 of

8 title 13, United States Code, is amended by insert-9 ing after section 13 the following:

10 "§14. Budget requests

11 "(a) With respect to the budget request of the Bu-12 reau for fiscal year 2027 and each fiscal year thereafter 13 submitted to the President for inclusion in the annual 14 budget submission under section 1105(a) of title 31, the 15 Secretary shall include in such request the estimated costs 16 of carrying out the duties of the Bureau during the five-17 year period beginning on the fiscal year covered by such 18 request.

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1 "(b) On the date that the estimate of costs are sub-2 mitted to the President under subsection (a), the Sec-3 retary shall submit such estimate to the Committee on 4 Oversight and Reform of the House of Representatives, the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental 5 Affairs of the Senate, the Committees on the Budget of 6 7 the House of Representatives and the Senate, and the 8 Committees on Appropriations of the House of Representatives and the Senate.". 9

10 (2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sec-11 tions for such subchapter is amended by inserting 12 after the item relating to section 13 the following 13 new item:

4 "(2) FUNCTIONS.—The Deputy Director shall
5 perform such functions as the Director shall des6 ignate. During any absence or disability of the Di7 rector, the Deputy Director shall act as Director.

8 "(3) VACANCY.—In the event of a vacancy in 9 the office of Director, or when the Director is absent 10 or unable to serve, the Deputy Director shall act as 11 Director until a Director is appointed. If no indi-12 vidual is serving as Deputy Director, the highest 13 level career employee of the Bureau shall act as Di-14 rector until a Deputy Director or Director is ap-15 pointed. This paragraph shall serve as the exclusive 16 means of designating an acting Director.

17 "(e) Advisory Committees.—

18 "(1) GENERAL AUTHORITY.—In accordance 19 with the Federal Advisory Committee Act (5 U.S.C. 20 App.), and subject to paragraph (2), the Director 21 may establish advisory committees to provide advice 22 with respect to the mission of the Bureau. Members 23 of any such committee, including a committee estab-24 lished under paragraph (2), shall serve without com-25 pensation, but shall be entitled to transportation ex-

penses and per diem in lieu of subsistence in accord ance with section 5703 of title 5.

3 "(2) Specific advisory committees.— 4 "(A) BUREAU OF THE CENSUS ADVISORY 5 COMMITTEE ON STATISTICAL QUALITY STAND-6 ARDS.—The Director shall appoint a committee, 7 to be known as the 'Advisory Committee on 8 Statistical Quality Standards', composed of five 9 members to review and provide recommenda-10 tions on the statistical quality standards of the 11 Bureau that guide the production and release of 12 all Bureau decennial census products.

13 NATIONAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE "(B) 14 AND SCIENTIFIC ADVISORY COMMITTEE.—There 15 are hereby established the Bureau of the Census Scientific Advisory Committee and the Cen-16 17 sus Bureau National Advisory Committee on 18 Racial, Ethnic, and Other Populations, as de-19 scribed in the charters for each such committee 20 published on March 15, 2022, and March 23, 21 2022, respectively, or any subsequent charters. 22 Such advisory committees shall operate under 23 the terms and conditions set forth in the applicable charter. 24

1	"(C) 2030 CENSUS ADVISORY COM-
2	MITTEE.—The Director shall appoint an advi-
3	sory committee, substantially similar to the
4	2010 Census Advisory Committee, consisting of
5	up to 20 member organizations to address pol-
6	icy, research, and technical issues related to the
7	design and implementation of the 2030 decen-
8	nial census and the American Community Sur-
9	vey.".

14	(d) Position Requirements.—Section 22 of title
15	13, United States Code, is amended—

17	"(a) IN GENERAL.—All permanent"; and

19	"(b) Positions.—Each position within the Bureau
20	shall be a career position within the civil service, except
21	for the position of the Director and not more than two
22	other positions.".

1	SEC. 3. LIMITATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE DE-
2	CENNIAL CENSUS.
3	Section 141 of title 13, United States Code, is
4	amended—
5	(1) by redesignating subsection (g) as sub-
6	section (i); and
7	(2) by inserting after subsection (f) the fol-
8	lowing:
9	"(g) Limitations and Requirements.—
10	"(1) NOTICE TO CONGRESS OF SUBJECTS,
11	TYPES OF INFORMATION, AND QUESTIONS.—In the
12	2030 decennial census of population and each decen-
13	nial census thereafter, the Secretary may not include
14	any subject, type of information, or question that
15	was not submitted to Congress in accordance with
16	subsection (f).
17	"(2) BIANNUAL REPORTS.—
18	"(A) SUBMISSION TO CONGRESS.—Not
19	later than April 1 of the calendar year begin-
20	ning after the date of enactment of the Ensur-
21	ing a Fair and Accurate Census Act and bian-
22	nually thereafter, the Secretary shall submit to
23	Congress a report that—
24	"(i) describes each component of the
25	operational plan for the subsequent decen-
26	nial census of population; and

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1	"(ii) includes a detailed statement on
2	the status of all research, testing, and op-
3	erations that are part of the Bureau's com-
4	prehensive plan for the decennial census.
5	"(B) INTERNET PUBLICATION.—On the
6	date on which the Secretary submits a report
7	under subparagraph (A), the Secretary shall
8	publish the report on the public internet website
9	of the Bureau.
10	"(3) Secretary certification.—
11	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, upon
12	the date of submission of the report required by
13	subsection $(f)(2)$, shall submit, to the commit-
14	tees of Congress having legislative jurisdiction
15	over the census, a certification stating that any
16	question that has not appeared on the previous
17	two decennial censuses has been researched,
18	studied, and tested according to established sta-
19	tistical policies and procedures.
20	"(B) GAO REVIEW.—Not later than 6
21	months after the Secretary submits a certifi-
22	cation under paragraph (2), the Comptroller
23	General of the United States shall review such
24	certification and submit a report to Congress on
25	whether the questions to be included in the cen-

1	sus have been researched, studied, and tested
2	according to established statistical policies and
3	procedures."; and
4	(3) in subsection (i), as so redesignated, by in-
5	serting "Definition.—" before "As used in".
6	SEC. 4. DECENNIAL CENSUS LIFECYCLE COST ESTIMATES.
7	Section 141 of title 13, United States Code, as
8	amended by section 3, is further amended by inserting
9	after subsection (g) the following:
10	"(h) LIFECYCLE COSTS.—
11	"(1) ESTIMATE.—Not later than January 1,
12	2026, and every ten years thereafter, the Director
13	shall transmit to the chairs of the committees de-
14	scribed in paragraph (3) a lifecycle cost estimate for
15	the decennial census of population first occurring
16	after the date of such transmittal. Such estimate
17	shall include the following with respect to such
18	lifecycle:
19	"(A) An estimate of costs by each fiscal
20	year.
21	"(B) Estimates of capital versus operating
22	expenses.
23	"(C) Staffing projections for each year.
24	"(D) Assumptions about response rates,
25	wages, and other economic variables.

1	"(2) UPDATE.—On the date the President sub-
2	mits the annual budget under section 1105(a) of
3	title 31 during any calendar year a decennial of cen-
4	sus of population is taken under this section, and on
5	the date such annual budget is submitted during the
6	immediately preceding four calendar years, the Di-
7	rector shall transmit a report describing any changes
8	to the applicable lifecycle estimate transmitted under
9	paragraph (1). Such report shall include the fol-
10	lowing:
11	"(A) The basis for any such changes.
12	"(B) Projected impacts on response rates,
13	staffing requirements, or costs throughout the
14	lifecycle.
15	"(C) An explanation of any differences in
16	budgetary resources between the amount re-
17	quested in the President's annual budget re-
18	quest and the lifecycle cost estimate, as updated
19	by this paragraph.
20	"(3) Committees.—The committees described
21	in this paragraph are the Committee on Oversight
22	and Reform of the House of Representatives, the
23	Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental
24	Affairs of the Senate, and the Committees on Appro-

- 2 Senate.".

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
