Ms. SALINAS (for herself, Ms. BONAMICI, Mr. BLUMENAUER, Ms. HOYLE of Oregon, and Mrs. CHAVEZ-DEREMER) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To amend the Grand Ronde Reservation Act, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Grand Ronde Reserva-
5 tion Act Amendment of 2023”.

6 **SEC. 2. GRAND RONDE RESERVATION ACT AMENDMENT.**

7 Section 1(d) of Public Law 100–425 (commonly
8 known as the “Grand Ronde Reservation Act”; 102 Stat.
9 1594; 108 Stat. 4566) is amended—

1 (1) in paragraph (1), by striking “lands within
2 the State of Oregon” and inserting “the 84 acres
3 known as the Thompson Strip”;

4 (2) by redesignating paragraph (2) as para-
5 graph (3); and

6 (3) by inserting after paragraph (1) the fol-
7 lowing:

8 “(2) GAMING PROHIBITION.—Any real property
9 obtained by the Tribes as part of a land claim settle-
10 ment approved by the United States, including any
11 real property purchased with funds granted as part
12 of any land claim settlement, shall not be eligible, or
13 used, for any class II gaming or class III gaming
14 under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (25 U.S.C.
15 2701 et seq.) (as those terms are defined in section
16 4 of that Act (25 U.S.C. 2703)).”.

17 **SEC. 3. TREATY RIGHTS OF FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED**
18 **TRIBES.**

19 Nothing in this Act, or an amendment made by this
20 Act, shall be construed to enlarge, confirm, adjudicate, af-
21 fect, or modify any treaty right of an Indian Tribe (as
22 defined in section 4 of the Indian Self-Determination and
23 Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 5304)).

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
