Mr. McCORMICK introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs

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## A BILL

To require certain bureaus of the Department of State and the United States Agency for International Development to release quarterly reviews of certain grants, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Assessing Unintended

5       Drivers of Illegal Trafficking Act” or the “AUDIT Act”.

1   **SEC. 2. LATIN AMERICA MIGRANT SERVICES GRANT TRANS-**

2                   **PARENCEY.**

3                 (a) The Department of State's Bureau of Population,

4   Refugees, and Migration shall:

5                 (1) Issue a quarterly report documenting all the  
6   Bureau of Population, Refugees, and Migration  
7   grant money spent on migrant and asylum-seeker  
8   programs in Central and South America. The report  
9   shall explain why each implementing partner was  
10   chosen, the amount of money it received, the avail-  
11   ability of asylum claim processing in the countries in  
12   which those partners operate, and the number of  
13   claims processed in those countries. The report shall  
14   include—

15                 (A) grants given to non-governmental or-  
16   ganization implementing partners which are  
17   building asylum shelters or creating asylum  
18   processing capacity in Central and South Amer-  
19   ica;

20                 (B) grants given to implementing partners  
21   conducting casework, counseling, or legal rep-  
22   resentation for asylum seekers; and

23                 (C) grants given to implementing partners  
24   providing other services to asylum seekers, in-  
25   cluding transportation, monetary assistance,  
26   and housing.

1                             (2) Be prohibited from giving grants to imple-  
2                             menting partners which provide abortion services to  
3                             asylum seekers. This includes implementing part-  
4                             ners—

5                             (A) providing sexual and reproductive  
6                             health services that include referrals to receive  
7                             abortions;

8                             (B) providing assistance in obtaining abor-  
9                             tions;

10                             (C) providing the abortion procedure itself;  
11                             and

12                             (D) which directly or indirectly fund abor-  
13                             tions or services for obtaining abortions in any  
14                             manner for asylum seekers.

15                             (b) The Department of State's Bureau of Democracy,  
16                             Human Rights, and Labor shall:

17                             (1) Issue a quarterly report documenting all the  
18                             Bureau of Democracy, Human Rights, and Labor  
19                             grants given to migrant and asylum seeker rights  
20                             programs in Central and South America. The report  
21                             shall explain why each implementing partner was  
22                             chosen, the amount of money it received, the avail-  
23                             ability of asylum claim processing in the countries in  
24                             which those partners operate, and the number of

1 claims processed in those countries. The report shall  
2 include—

3 (A) direct grants from the Bureau of De-  
4 mocracy, Human Rights, and Labor to migrant  
5 shelters;

6 (B) grants to non-governmental organiza-  
7 tion implementing partners that provide grants  
8 or programming to other non-governmental or-  
9 ganizations or migrants rights organizations;

10 (C) the Bureau of Democracy, Human  
11 Rights, and Labor programming for building  
12 local asylum processing capacity or improving  
13 institutional transparency or efficiency;

14 (D) grants given to implementing partners  
15 conducting casework, counseling, or legal rep-  
16 resentation for asylum seekers; and

17 (E) any other programs the Bureau of De-  
18 mocracy, Human Rights, and Labor funds for  
19 the purpose of promoting migrant or asylum  
20 seeker rights.

21 (2) Be prohibited from giving grants to imple-  
22 menting partners who provide abortion services to  
23 asylum seekers. This includes implementing part-  
24 ners—

- 1                             (A) providing sexual and reproductive  
2                             health services that include referrals to receive  
3                             abortions;
- 4                             (B) providing assistance in obtaining abor-  
5                             tions;
- 6                             (C) providing the abortion procedure itself;
- 7                             (D) who directly or indirectly fund abor-  
8                             tions or services for obtaining abortions in any  
9                             manner for asylum seekers; and
- 10                           (E) which directly or indirectly fund abor-  
11                             tions in any manner for asylum seekers, provi-  
12                             sions, or assistance in obtaining an abortion.

13                         (c) The United States Agency for International De-  
14                             velopment shall:

15                             (1) Issue a quarterly report documenting all the  
16                             United States Agency for International Development  
17                             grants given to migrant, asylum seeker, and inter-  
18                             nally displaced persons programs in Central and  
19                             South America. The report shall explain why each  
20                             implementing partner was chosen, the amount of  
21                             money it received, the availability of asylum claim  
22                             processing in the countries in which those partners  
23                             operate, and the number of claims processed in  
24                             those countries. The report shall include—

- 1                         (A) direct grants from the United States  
2                         Agency for International Development to mi-  
3                         grant shelters;
- 4                         (B) grants from the Bureau for Humani-  
5                         tarian Assistance to implementing partners in  
6                         the region working with migrants and asylum  
7                         seekers;
- 8                         (C) prosperity, security, and governance  
9                         grants given to El Salvador, Guatemala, and  
10                         Honduras;
- 11                         (D) integration grants to Belize, Costa  
12                         Rica, and Panama;
- 13                         (E) grants given to resettle and integrate  
14                         Venezuelans outside their country and grants to  
15                         implementing partners operating within Ven-  
16                         ezuela;
- 17                         (F) grants or programs related to mes-  
18                         saging to citizens of Central and South Amer-  
19                         ica; and
- 20                         (G) grants given for governmental institu-  
21                         tional capacity building.

22                         (2) Be prohibited from giving grants to imple-  
23                         menting partners which provide abortion services to  
24                         asylum seekers. This includes implementing part-  
25                         ners—

1                             (A) providing sexual and reproductive  
2                             health services that include referrals to receive  
3                             abortions;

4                             (B) providing assistance in obtaining abor-  
5                             tions;

6                             (C) providing the abortion procedure itself;

7                             (D) who directly or indirectly fund abor-  
8                             tions or services for obtaining abortions in any  
9                             manner for asylum seekers; and

10                           (E) which directly or indirectly fund abor-  
11                             tions in any manner for asylum seekers, provi-  
12                             sions, or assistance in obtaining an abortion.

13                           (d) The reports by the Bureau of Population, Refu-  
14                             gees, and Migration, the Bureau of Democracy, Human  
15                             Rights, and Labor, and the United States Agency for  
16                             International Development shall begin the quarter after  
17                             this legislation is enacted.
