*January 18, 2024.*

*Resolved*, That the bill from the House of Representatives (H.R. 2872) entitled “An Act to amend the Permanent Electronic Duck Stamp Act of 2013 to allow the Secretary of the Interior to issue electronic stamps under such Act, and for other purposes.”, do pass with the following

**AMENDMENT:**

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

*(b) SENATE PAYGO SCORECARDS.—The budgetary effects of this division shall not be entered on any PAYGO scorecard maintained for purposes of section 4106 of H. Con. Res. 71 (115th Congress).*

1       (c) *CLASSIFICATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.*—Not-  
 2   withstanding Rule 3 of the Budget Scorekeeping Guidelines  
 3   set forth in the joint explanatory statement of the committee  
 4   of conference accompanying Conference Report 105–217  
 5   and section 250(c)(8) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-  
 6   gency Deficit Control Act of 1985, the budgetary effects of  
 7   this division shall not be estimated—

8               (1) for purposes of section 251 of such Act;

9               (2) for purposes of an allocation to the Com-  
 10   mittee on Appropriations pursuant to section 302(a)  
 11   of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974; and

12              (3) for purposes of paragraph (4)(C) of section  
 13   3 of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010 as  
 14   being included in an appropriation Act.
